Christina Villanueva issues this Citation: Assessment of Fine and Order of Abatement (Citation) in her official capacity as Discipline Manager for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (Bureau) of the California Department of Consumer Affairs.

CITATION

A Citation is hereby issued to Maricel Nguyen, Owner of MEDTEK College Hayward (Institution) located at 3524 Breakwater Ave, Suite E, Hayward, CA 94545 pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.9 and 149; California Education Code (CEC) section 94944; and Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5, CCR) section 75020 for the violation(s) described below.

BACKGROUND

On December 4, 2019, the Bureau received a complaint alleging that the Institution was operating without Bureau approval. Furthermore, the complainant stated that they attempted to enroll in the Sterile Processing Technician Program at a cost of \$4,000.00 for tuition.

Through the course of the investigation, the Bureau determined that the Institution was operating without Bureau approval and is not exempt under any provision of the Private Postsecondary Act of 2009.

VIOLATION(S)

#	Below you will find the California Education Code (CEC) and/or Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5, CCR code) section(s) of law you are charged with violating.
1.	<p>Violation: CEC Section 94886. Approval to Operate Required <i>“Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter.”</i></p> <p>CEC Section 94817.5. Approved to Operate or Approved</p>

“Approved to operate” or “approved” means that an institution has received authorization pursuant to this chapter to offer to the public and to provide postsecondary educational programs.”

CEC Section 94868. To Offer to the Public

“To offer to the public” means to advertise, publicize, solicit, or recruit.”

CEC Section 94869. To Operate

“To operate” means to establish, keep, or maintain any facility or location in this state where, or from which, or through which, postsecondary educational programs are provided.”

On January 22, 2020, Bureau staff attempted to reach Institution staff by phone. The attempt was unsuccessful and Bureau staff left a voicemail. However, Bureau staff did not receive a response.

On June 12, 2020, Bureau staff reviewed the Institution’s website. The Bureau sent the Institution an email that was located at <http://www.medtekcollegehayward.com>. However, Bureau staff did not receive a response.

On July 9, 2020, Bureau staff attempted to reach Institution staff by phone and left a voicemail. Bureau staff did not receive a response.

On August 27, 2020, Bureau staff reviewed the Institution’s website and found advertisements for recruitment by the Institution for the Sterile Processing Technician Program. The website listed classes scheduled for weekends during the evenings in September 2020 and on the weekends during the day in November 2020. Furthermore, the website listed the following tuition costs for the Sterile Processing Technician Program:

- Reservation Fee - \$100.00
- Supplies Fee - \$400.00
- Program Tuition Fee - \$3,500.00

In addition, the website listed the following fees:

- Exam Certification Fee (to be eligible for externship) - \$125.00
- Drug Test and Background (Pre-requisite for externship) - \$150.00
- American Red Cross BLS CPR (Pre-requisite for externship) - \$75.00

The tuition cost for the Sterile Processing Technician Program as advertised on the Institution’s website totaled \$4,350.00.

On August 28, 2020, Bureau staff conducted an onsite investigation at the Institution. Bureau staff made contact with Institution staff and notified Institution staff that they have been operating as an unapproved private postsecondary institution by establishing a physical presence and actively advertising the Sterile Processing Technician Program to the public with tuition exceeding \$2,500.00. Institution staff confirmed this information to be true by providing documentation, student enrollment agreements, and student rosters with the amount of tuition each student paid.

In addition, based on documentation provided by Institution staff, Bureau staff was able to confirm that the Institution has been operating without Bureau approval since February 2013.

To date, the Institution does not have a current Approval to Operate a private postsecondary institution nor are they operating under the specification of the exemption under CEC section 94874(f).

Order of Abatement:

The Bureau orders that the Institution cease to operate as a private postsecondary educational institution, unless the Institution qualifies for an exemption under CEC section 94874. The Institution must discontinue recruiting or enrolling students and cease all instructional services and advertising in any form or type of media, including <http://www.medtekcollegehayward.com>, and any other websites not identified here that are associated with the Institution, until such time as an approval to operate is obtained from the Bureau. The Institution must disconnect all telephone service numbers including, but not limited to, (510) 432-0366, that are associated with the Institution until such time as an approval to operate is obtained from the Bureau. To comply with the Order of Abatement the Institution must submit a school closure plan to the Bureau pursuant to California Education Code section 94926. The Institution must provide a roster of each student currently enrolled at the Institution. The roster must include the names of the students, their contact information (including phone number, email address, and physical address), the programs in which they are enrolled, the amount paid for the programs.

Assessment of Fine

The fine for this violation is \$25,000.00

TOTAL ADMINISTRATIVE FINE DUE: \$25,000.00

ASSESSMENT OF A FINE

In accordance with CEC section 94944; and 5, CCR section 75020(b), the Bureau hereby orders this assessment of a fine in the amount of **\$25,000.00** for the violations described above. **Payment must be made, to the Bureau, within 30 days from the date of service of the Citation.**

COMPLIANCE WITH ORDER OF ABATEMENT

In accordance with the provisions of 5, CCR section 75020 (b) the Bureau hereby issues the order(s) of abatement described above. In accordance with Business and Professions Code Section 149, the Bureau may disconnect any telephone service numbers used by an unapproved Institution. **Evidence of compliance with the order(s) of abatement must be submitted, to the Bureau, within 30 days from the date of service of the Citation.**

APPEAL OF CITATION

You have the right to contest this Citation through an informal conference with the Bureau; and/or through an administrative hearing in accordance with Chapter 5 (Commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

If you wish to contest this Citation, you must submit the 'Notice of Appeal of Citation – Request for Informal Conference and/or Administrative Hearing' form (enclosed) within **30 days** from the date of service of the Citation. *If you do not request an informal conference and/or an administrative hearing within 30 days from the service of the Citation, you will not be able to request one at a later time.*

Unless a written request for an informal conference and/or an administrative hearing is signed by you and delivered to the Bureau by **January 1, 2021**, you will be deemed to have waived or forfeited your right to appeal this matter.

EFFECTIVE DATE OF CITATION

If you do not request an informal conference and/or an administrative hearing, this Citation shall become effective on **December 2, 2020**. Payment of the administrative fine and evidence of compliance with the order(s) of abatement shall be due by **January 1, 2021**. Your payment of the administrative fine shall not constitute an admission of the violation(s) charged.

If a hearing is requested, you will not be required to comply with this Citation until 30 days after a final order is entered against you.

The Bureau will promptly take all appropriate action to enforce this Citation and recover the civil penalties prescribed therein or found to be due after a hearing.
