After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro rata refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the scheduled hours in your program through the last day of attendance.

- Cancellation may occur when the student provides a written notice of cancellation at the following address: Estes Institute of Cosmetology Arts & Sciences, 324 E. Main Street, Visalia, California This can be done by mail or by hand delivery.
- 3. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective when deposited in the mail properly addressed with proper postage.
- 4. The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, it is effective if it shows that the student no longer wishes to be bound by the Enrollment Agreement.
- 5. If the Enrollment Agreement is cancelled the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$100.00, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.
- 6. If Estes Institute of Cosmetology Arts & Sciences closes or a program is cancelled subsequent to a student's enrollment, Estes Institute of Cosmetology Arts & Sciences will refund all monies paid by the student.
