COMPENSATION

A successful graduate working as a full-time barber many expect to earn at least \$22,000 to \$32,000 per year. Barbers are usually paid on a commission, the norm being 70%. PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Barbering is a stress-free career. Barbers may work with little or no supervision. It entails standing or sitting on a stool while working on a patron. There is some shoulder, arm and hand muscle movement. The implements used weigh no more than 2 pounds.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

There are minimal safety risks with the use of electrical clippers, sharp shears and straight razor. The use of chemicals Such as hair tonic, hair cream, hair oil, hair spray, and shampoo is minimal or not at all.

CALIFORNIA LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

Proof of High School diploma or GED (10th grade equivalency with a passing score of 15 points on the Pre-Entrance Exam), Not less than 17 years of age at the time the State Board Exam, valid drivers license or government-issued picture I.D., Social Security Card, completion of required hours (1500 Barber Course and 400 Cosmetology/Barber Course), and a passing score of 75% or better on the California State Barber Exam.

"NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF UNITS AND DEGREES EARNED AT OUR SCHOOL"

Hours/Unit earned in the barber program, in most cases, will probably not be transferable to any other college or University. For example, if a student entered our school as a freshman, he/she will still be a freshman when entering another college or university at some time in the future even though student earned hours/units here.
