Orange County CPR is proud to offer our accelerated Emergency Medical Technician course. Our curriculum is covered over a 10 week period that meets 3 days per week. This course is broken down into 3 sections which equates to 148 hours total.

Classroom lecture (Didactic) - 128 hours
Clinical Observations (Field) - 20 hours
- 10 hours in Trauma ER
- 10 hours on Ambulance

Our EMT training program is specifically designed for the very ambitious and hard-working individual. We strongly encourage to all students to search and find a program that best suits their needs.

For 2011, Orange County CPR had the following for 100% of published program length:


