The California Private Postsecondary Education Act of 2009 established the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE). The purpose of the BPPE is to ensure minimum educational quality standards and opportunities and meaningful student protections.

Under section 94910 of the Act, each school approved by the BPPE must provide information for each program offered in regards to completion rates, placement rates, licensure exam passage rates, and salary/wage information.

8 "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

9 Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

"Salaries for Management Analysts vary widely by years of experience and education, geographic location, sector of expertise, and size of employer. Some may also receive bonuses for outstanding work. About one quarter of Management Analysts are self-employed and work on a contract basis.

"The median wage in 2012 for Management Analysts in California is \$84,448 annually or \$40.60 hourly. The median is the point at which half of the workers earn more and half earn less."
