1.Completion Rates

Most of our students transfer to community college or universities before completion of the program.*

² "Students available for graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of "students unavailable for graduation," which means those students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

³ "Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

⁴ "Completion Rate" is the number of Graduates divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.

"Graduates unavailable for employment" means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

⁸ "Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

⁹ Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

¹³ Number of Students Taking Exam is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of published program length and for whom the reported exam is the first exam that was available after their completion of the program.

¹⁴ Number of Students Who Passed the First Exam Taken is the number of students who took and passed the licensing exam in the reported calendar year on the first attempt.

¹⁵ Passage Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam the first time that they take it by the number of graduates who took the licensing exam for the first time after completion of the program.
