**Benjamin University's** undergraduate and graduate degree programs are designed either (1) to prepare Christian men and women for various ministries in church settings or (2) to further train those who are already serving as pastors or other church workers.

The University, however, neither advertises nor promises that any of its degree programs leads to paid, part-time, or full-time, church positions in such traditional ministry areas as pastoral leadership and caring, Christian education, church music, and Christian counseling.

The University, moreover, provides no placement assistance.

Although graduate of the Master of Divinity program generally seek ordained ministries in the church, the program does not guarantee that its curriculum will meet the basic requirements for examination or licensure in any church, denomination, or organization.
