The majority of students enrolled at EPIC Bible College register for classes on a part time basis (less than 12 quarter units per quarter) and, therefore, finish a program outside of the published program length.

Completion rates for each program are calculated by dividing the number of graduates by the number of students available for graduation (students available for graduation are those scheduled, based on full time enrollment status, to complete the program within the scheduled program length). A majority of EPIC students are part time students and finish a program of study outside the normal length.
