2. School's research showed that California rates for the above fields are lower than Northern States in 2010 and 2011.

1. How to become a Hairdresser or Cosmetologist, Skin Care Specialist, Manicurist and Pedicurist?

All States require the above operators and specialists to be licensed, with the exception of shampooers. To qualify for a license, candidates must graduate from a State- approved cosmetology program, state approved barbering program, state approved esthetician program, or state approved manicurist program.

2. What is the median wage?

The median wage is the wage at which half the workers in this occupation earned more than that amount and half earned less.

3. What Hairdressers and Cosmetologists do?

They offer a wide range of hair services for male and female patrons. Such services includes: haircutting, hair styling, permanent waving/ chemical straightening, hair coloring and bleaching, texturizing, skin care, hair removal, manual or electrical facial, makeup, nail care, manicure, pedicure, artificial nails and nail wraps.

Hairdressers and cosmetologists also work as a salon owner, salon manager, product demonstrator, styling publicist, or even work in the teaching field as a cosmetologist instructor.

4. What Skin Care Specialists do?

Licensed estheticians or skin-care specialists also have a wide range of career options. Skin- care specialists can perform hair removal, manual or electrical facial, head and neck massages, full body treatment, makeup, and skin care treatment, such as peels, masks, or scrubs, to remove dead and dry skin.

Estheticians also work as managers of a spa and salon. Others own spa or salon, product demonstrator, film or fashion makeup artist, esthetic training specialist and more.

5. What Manicurists and Pedicurists do?

Manicurists and Pedicurists work exclusively on the hands and feet, providing nail beauty techniques, professional nail products, and treatments to groom fingernails and toenails.

Nail specialist offers services as manicure, pedicures, artificial nail, nail wraps, and nail designs. Other licensed manicurist also works as salon/spa manger, salon/ spa owner, nail product demonstrator, nail technology instructor and more.

6. How did we take care about job placement and how we know the salary of our graduates?

* When preparing the completion and the application for examination of graduates, our school requested them to fill out a Graduate Exit Interview as follows:

1. When you pass the State Board Examination, do you plan to work?
2. If you do not know where you plan to work, do you think that the job opportunity in school will help you get a job?
3. Do you intend to seek employment related to the program of study?

This school has a demanded list for employment related to the graduates' study programs which have been requested by the salon owners. The school will provide it to them, if needed.

* Almost the students enrolled at our school, their family or their relatives have been owned a beauty salon. So after getting license, they got job right away. The school just helps seek jobs for a small remaining number.

* Almost the graduates and the salon owners just provide feedback about the job placement, but they are seldom to feed back about the salary. Regarding to the salary information, almost we got it from their relatives, their friends who have worked the same shop with them, when they come back school to enroll other courses. So that is how we know that the median pay per year for our graduates is not too far, if compared with the average wages which were searched by the US Bureau of Labor. With the above sources, they got tip at least or more than 10% of their gross labor wages.

Prior to signing the enrollment agreement, I received a catalog and a School Performance Fact Sheet, which I was encouraged to review and physically visited the school (Classes, clinic instruction area) prior to signing this agreement. These documents contain important policies and performance data for this institution. This institution required me to sign and date the information included in the School Performance Fact Sheet relating to completion rates, placement rates, license examination passage rates, and salaries or wages, prior to signing this agreement.
