PERFORMANCE FACT SHEET COMPLETION, PLACEMENT, LICENSURE, & SALARY DISCLOSURE REQUIREMENTS

Reporting Period: January 2010 – December 2011

DEFINITIONS

COMPLETION RATES

- **Number of Students Who Began Program** - The number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within the reporting calendar year.
- **Students Available for Graduation** - The number of students who began the program minus the number of "Students unavailable for graduation," which means those students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

Note: "Students unavailable for graduation" does not include students who have transferred, withdrawn, requested a Leave Of Absence (LOA), or were academically dismissed.
- **Graduates** - The number of students who complete a program within 100 percent of the published program length.
- **Completion Rate** - Calculated by dividing the Number of **Graduates** divided by the Number of **Students Available for Graduation**.
- **150% Graduates** - The number of students who completed the program within 150% of the published program length.
- **150% Completion Rate** - The number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 101-150% of the published program length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published program length period.

PLACEMENT RATES

- **Graduates available for employment** - The number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- **Graduates employed in the field** - Graduates who are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.
- **Graduates unavailable for employment** - Graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education at an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- **Hours working:** Graduates employed in the field shall be reported for those graduates employed in the field in a single position that averages under 32 hours per week and those employed in the field in a single position that averages at least 32 hours per week.

EXAMINATION PASSAGE RATES

- **Number of Students Taking Exam:** The number of students who completed the program within 150% of published program length and for whom the reported exam is the first exam that was available after their completion of the program.
- **Exam Date:** The date for the first available exam after the students completed the program.
- **Passage Rate:** is calculated by dividing the number of students who pass the exam by the number of graduates who take the reported licensing exam.
