Compensation:

According to "Money" Magazine, the average Hairdresser/Cosmetologist in the United States makes about \$30,000 annually. A graduate of our school should expect their first entry-level job to make slightly more than minimum wage. Plus commission on salon sales and services. A typical Cosmetologist is paid 50-60% of the revenue produced from salon services they perform, and are paid up to 20% on the retail sales they make.

Those working in the field of cosmetology held about 712,200 jobs in 2010. On average, the minimum amount made annually is \$22,000 and ranges up to \$41,000.
