



## Natural Chef Training Program School Performance Fact Sheet

The California Postsecondary Education Act of 2009, which is effective January 1, 2010, requires under section 94910 of CPPEA that a school provide information for each program offered in regards to completion rates, placement rates, licensure exam passage rates, and salary/wage information. The following information is data compiled from January 1, 2009 to December 31, 2010.

<sup>1</sup> “Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began a program who are scheduled to complete the program within the reporting calendar year.

<sup>2</sup> “Students available for graduation” is the number of students who began program minus the number of “Students unavailable for graduation,” which means those students who have dropped the program, died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

<sup>3</sup> “Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

<sup>4</sup> “Completion Rate” is the number of Graduates divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.

<sup>5</sup> “150% Graduates is the number of students who completed the program within 101 – 150% of the published program length.

<sup>6</sup> “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 101% - 150% of the published program length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published program length period.

<sup>1</sup> “Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within the reporting calendar year.

<sup>2</sup> “Number of Graduates” is the number of students who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

<sup>3</sup> Bauman College curriculum is different from other career schools in that some of our students attend purely out of a desire to learn healthy eating and cooking habits to support themselves and their family. These respondents reported to us that they enrolled in their Bauman College program for personal reasons, not for career purposes.

<sup>4</sup> “Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. “Graduates unavailable for employment” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution. At Bauman College, this also means graduates who indicated that they participated in our curriculum for personal reasons only.

<sup>5</sup> “Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

<sup>6</sup> Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

\* 5 additional grads not available for employment: 3 grads moved on to further education, 1 grad stayed with old job full time, 1 grad moved back to Canada.
