<sup>5</sup> “Placement Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

<sup>5</sup> Use of the term “Placement Rate”, although it is meant to refer to employment rate, might be misleading. The Sanville Institute does not place graduates in any employment setting, and in fact students are already employed in the field when they enter the program.
