⁹ “Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position. (This is the definition that was in use for “Graduates employed in the field” at the time these number were calculated.)

¹⁰ Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
