TABLE 1

"Number of Students Who Began Program" means the number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within the reporting calendar year.

"Students available for graduation" equals the number of students who began the program minus the number of "Students unavailable for graduation," which means students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

"Graduates" is the number of students who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

"Completion Rate" is calculated by dividing the Number of Graduates by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.

"Completion Rate" means the number of students completing the program within 101-150% of the published program length.

TABLE 2

"Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

"Graduates unavailable for employment" means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

"Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

"Placement Rates" are calculated by dividing the number of graduates employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment for a program that is: designed, or advertised, to lead to a particular career; or advertised or promoted with any claim regarding job placement.

"150% Placement Rate" means those rates calculated for students who completed the program within 101-150% of published program length.

TABLE 3

"Number of Graduates" means the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year and were eligible to take the licensing exam.

"Number Who Passed First Exam Taken" means the number of graduates who took and passed the licensing exam on the first attempt.

"Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who pass the exam the first time that they take it by the number of graduates who took the licensing exam for the first time after completion of the program.

TABLE 4

"Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. Graduates unavailable for employment means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

"Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

Salary is as reported by the student. Not all graduates reported salary.
