BARBER COURSE

In 2012 five (5) students were scheduled to graduate and four (4) completed, for a completion rate of 80%. Seven (7) students took the California State Barber Exam and six (6) passed for an 86% Licensing rate. All licensed Barber's were employed as Barbers within one month for 100% placement rate.

COMPENSATION

A successful graduate working as a full-time Barber may expect to earn between \$25- \$35,000 per year. Barber's can be paid on commission, the norm being 70% or Barbers can rent a chair and pay booth rent. We do not guarantee nor imply any set amount or whether the pay will be on a commission, an hourly rate or by chair rental. Borner's Barber College does not and cannot promise or guarantee employment nor level of income or wage to any student or graduate.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Barbering is a very stress-free career. Barbers work with little or no supervision. There is standing while working on a patron, with shoulder, arm and hand muscle movement.

SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

There are minimal safety risks with use of electrical clippers, sharp shears and straight razor. There is very little or no use of chemicals in Barbering. Such as hair tonic, hair cream, hair oil, hair color, chemical straighteners, and shampoo.

CALIFORNIA LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

Proof of High School Diploma or GED, valid government issued picture I.D., Social Security card, completion of required hours (1500 for the Barber course) and a passing score of 75% or better on the California State Barber Exams.

"NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF UNITS AND DEGREES EARNED"

Units earned in our Barber program, in most cases, will probably not be transferable to any other college or university. For example, if you enter our school as a freshman, you will still be a freshman if you enter another college or university at some time in the future even though you earned units here at our school.
