



SCHOOL PERFORMANCE FACT SHEET

The California Private Postsecondary Education Act (CPPEA) of 2009, effective January 1, 2010, requires under section 94910 of the Act that a school provide information for each program offered in regards to, completion rates, placement rates, licensure exam passage rates, and salary/wage information. ² “Students available for graduation” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of “Students unavailable for graduation”, which means those students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

³ “Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

⁴ “Completion Rate (100%)” is the number of Graduates divided by the Number of Students available for Graduation.

⁵ “Completion Rate (150%)” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year with 101-150% of the published program length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published program length period.

³ “Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. “Graduates unavailable for employment” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institute.

⁴ “Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

⁵ Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

³ “BVNPT Passage Rate” is the Board of Vocational Nursing & Psychiatric Technicians reported pass rate. This includes any student that takes the exam in the reported year.

⁴ “Passage rate of students passing the exam after first attempt” is the percentage of students passing the exam after the first attempt.

¹ “Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. “Graduates unavailable for employment” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institute.

² “Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

³ Salary is as reported by the student. Not all graduates reported salary.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that the “median annual wages of licensed practical and licensed vocational nurses were \$40,380 in May 2010. The median wage is the wage at which half the workers in an occupation earned more than that amount and half earned less. The lowest 10 percent earned less than \$29,680, and the highest 10 percent earned more than \$56,010.”

The California Employment Development Department reported the hourly mean for LVN's is: \$24.90.
