Completion Rate & Placement Rate Information

¹“*Number of Students Who Began Program*” is the number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program *within* the reporting calendar year.

²“*Students Available for Graduation*” is the number of students who began the program minus the number of “*Students Unavailable for Graduation*”, which means those students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

³“*Graduates*” is the number of students who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

⁴“*Completion Rates*” is the number of graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.

⁵“*150 % Graduates*” is the number of students who completed the program within 101- 150% of the published program length.

⁶“*150% Completion Rate*” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 101- 150% of the published program length divided by the number of students available for graduation in the published program length period.

⁷“*Graduates available for employment*” means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. “*Graduates unavailable for employment*” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty or who leave the state.

⁸“*Graduates employed in the field*” means graduates who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which skills obtained through education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

⁹“*Placement Rates*” is calculated by dividing the number for graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

**Note: The Lincoln Institute of Body Therapy encourages students to finish programs within the recommended program length; however, it is up to the student’s discretion as to which classes they take and when, according to their schedule and availability. Students who do not graduate within the recommended program length, and do not drop out of the program, are included in the 150% Completion Rate for the program in which they are enrolled.*
