² “Students available for graduation” is the number of students who began program minus the number of “Students unavailable for graduation,” which means those students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

³ “Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

⁴ “Completion Rate” is the number of Graduates divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.

⁵ “150% Graduates” is the number of students who completed the program within 101-150% of the published program length.

⁶ “150% Completion Rate” is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 101-150% of the published program length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published program length.

“Number of Students Who Began Program” means the number of students who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within the reporting calendar year.

“Number of Graduates” is the number of students who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length.

“Graduates available for employment” means the number of graduates who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. “Graduates unavailable for employment” means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

“Graduates employed in the field” means graduates who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length who report that they are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provided a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

Placement Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length who are gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

³ Pass Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who pass the exam the first time that they take it by the number of graduates who took the licensing exam for the first time after completion of the program.

Method of Calculation

¹ "Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment. Graduates unavailable for employment means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

"Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who have completed the program within 100% of the published program length who are gainfully employed in a single position for which the institution represents the program prepares its graduates within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the period of employment shall begin within six months of the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

Salary is as reported by the student. Not all graduates reported salary.

You may request a list of employment positions determined to be within the field for which a student received education and training, and a list of the objective sources of information used to substantiate the salary disclosures above, from the school Placement Office.

The most recent three-year cohort default rate as reported by the U.S. Department of Education is 0.0%.

Of the 79 LVN, 80 CNA, 31 HHA, and 71 Phlebotomy students who began the program and were scheduled to complete in 2012, 75 received student loans, 29%.
