## **APPENDIX C**

### **TB TESTING AND FINGERPRINTING FOR TEACHER EDUCATION STUDENTS**

TB testing and a Live Scan (electronic fingerprinting) are now mandatory for California employees and volunteers who are in contact with minors.

Because Waldorf Teacher Education students are required to practice teach in two to three field experiences, these tests are required prior to beginning the practicum.

Please note that regulations and costs for these tests vary from state to state so it is important to call the Waldorf school administrator for directions before the practicum begins.

**TB Test:** Any medical establishment or public health service can administer a TB test. They will need you to come back in two days, so plan accordingly. The cost is approximately \$20. Obtain a diploma documenting you have had the test. This diploma is good for 2 years and the school can take a copy from your original. State regulations regarding TB testing can be found under California Health & Safety Code No. 3454 at [www.ed.gov/pubs/RegPrivSchl/californ.html](http://www.ed.gov/pubs/RegPrivSchl/californ.html)

**LiveScan:** Contact the Waldorf School administrator for their DOJ number prior to taking this scan. The total cost for a LiveScan is approximately \$55-\$75. Part of this fee is paid at the LiveScan site (\$15-\$18) and the remaining amount is charged to the Waldorf School by the Department of Justice. It is the student's responsibility to reimburse the school. The information from this scan cannot be transmitted to anyone but the person authorized to read it at that particular Waldorf School. If you practice teach in different schools, you must have a LiveScan for each school.
