All courses and accommodation are offered subject to availability.

St Giles reserves the right to cancel a course or make changes to course arrangements without liability if obliged to by circumstances beyond its control. In such cases St Giles would seek to offer alternative arrangements, dates or venues, or a full refund of fees for tuition and accommodation.

Postponement of courses: the office must receive written notification at least 21 days before your course begins if you wish to transfer the deposits to a later course date. Non-EEA students on a General Student Visa must pay the UK Visa Fee (£10) each time a change in dates is requested.

Changes before arrival: Students must ensure that there is time to re-apply for a visa if changes affect their visa provisions. Except for course upgrades, requests for changes less than 7 days before the course begins are subject of an Amendment Fee of £25 (UK), \$40 (USA), C\$50 (Canada). Non-EEA students on a General Student Visa must pay the UK Visa Fee (£10) each time a change in dates is requested.

Students entering on a **General Student Visa (GSV)** for courses longer than 24 weeks must be at the language level outlined by UKBA. All students complete a level placement test on arrival at St Giles, and any GSV students at a lower level will be obliged to return home. Tuition fees will be retained as a credit (but not refunded) for a new course on a (Extended) Student Visitor Visa, with any balance refunded after the deduction of non-refundable charges (if applicable): UK Visa Fee, Airport Transfer charges, Express Mail Fee, Accommodation cancellation charges.

Courses of 1-8 weeks: Courses cannot be cancelled or shortened, or lessons reduced in number, and no tuition fees are refundable. There is no Amendment Fee for students requesting an upgrade to a more expensive course. Non-EEA students on a General Student Visa must pay the UK Visa Fee if they extend their course

Courses of 9+ weeks: For cancellations or changes to be effected from the 9th week onwards students must give 4 weeks' written notice from the following Monday. Tuition fees will be calculated to the end of the week when the cancellation or change takes effect, and 50% of any balance will be refunded, less the Amendment Fee. There is no Amendment Fee for students requesting an upgrade to a more expensive course. Non-EEA students on a General Student Visa must pay the UK Visa Fee if they extend their course

International Semester Courses (24+ weeks): Students requesting changes must check with the office that their proposals comply with their visa status. Students must give 4 weeks' written notice from the following Monday in order to cancel or change their course, or to move to another St Giles centre. If you decide to leave before the end of your period of study*, or downgrade to a less expensive course, tuition fees are not refunded, nor are they transferable to another student or another programme. For all students booking through agents, the office will check with agents before arranging any refunds, as refunds can only be made after receipt of funds paid via an agent. There is no Amendment Fee for students requesting an upgrade to a longer course or an increase in the number of lessons.

Courses of 1-4 weeks: Courses cannot be cancelled or shortened, or lessons reduced in number, and no tuition fees are refundable.

Courses of 5+ weeks: For cancellations or changes (e.g. to a cheaper course) to be effected from the 5th week onwards students must give 4 weeks' written notice from the following Monday. Training for Native and Near-Native Speakers of English

Teaching English as a foreign language is exciting, rewarding and immensely enjoyable. A qualification in ELT can open up opportunities to live and work in the UK and abroad, and meet people from all around the world. There are many different teacher training programmes on the market, from online courses to full-time MA qualifications, so it can be difficult to decide which course is best for you. If you are looking to take an initial teaching training course, St Giles recommends two courses: the **Cambridge CELTA** or the **Trinity Cert. TESOL**.



Both certificates are internationally recognised qualifications, which can help you to find a good teaching job with an accredited school.

Both courses offer:

- a four-week programme of intensive study
- teaching practice of six hours at two levels
- observation of experienced teachers in our international schools

- an internationally recognised certificate on completion
- five units of learning
- coursework assignments

In England, Wales and Northern Ireland both the TESOL and CELTA are recognised as being at Level Five of the National Qualifications Framework.

Cambridge CELTA Course Programme

Unit 1: Learners and teachers, and the teaching and learning context

Unit 2: Language analysis and awareness

Unit 3: Language skills: reading, listening, speaking and writing

Unit 4: Planning and resources for different contexts

Unit 5: Developing teaching skills and professionalism

There is no final examination; an external assessor appointed by Cambridge ESOL will moderate each course. There are two components of assessment as follows. To gain the certificate, you must pass both components. There are three grades: Pass, Pass 'B' and Pass 'A'.

Component One: Teaching Practice

You will be expected to teach for a total of six hours, working with classes at two ability levels. Assessment is continuous and based on your overall performance by the end of the six hours.

Component Two: Written Assignments

You will be asked to complete four written assignments; one focusing on adult learning; one on the language system of English; one on language skills and one on classroom teaching.

Trinity Cert. TESOL Course Programme

Unit 1: Teaching Skills

Unit 2: Language Awareness (including grammar, vocabulary and phonology)

Unit 3: Learner Profile

Unit 4: Materials Assignment

Unit 5: Unknown Language (experience learning a language unknown to you)

There is no final exam but the work for Units 1, 2, 3 and 5 is marked by your internal course tutors and Unit 4 by an external Trinity moderator. To gain the certificate you must pass all components. Trinity College London awards a Pass or Fail grade.

Teaching Practice

You will be expected to teach for a total of six hours, working with classes at two ability levels. Assessment is continuous and based on your overall performance by the end of the six hours.

Written Assignments

You will be asked to complete two written assignments; one will focus on adult learning, assessing individual learners' needs and providing them with one-to-one lessons; the other will involve creating your own teaching materials, using them in teaching practice and evaluating them.

On-going Coursework Assignments

You are expected to complete two coursework assignments, one Observation Journal and one Unknown Foreign Language Journal.

Test

A language awareness test will be given at the end of the course.

TESOL Courses

Entry Requirements for CELTA and Cert. TESOL

- No teaching experience necessary, but candidates should have a university degree or standard of education equivalent to that required for entry into higher education.
- Non-native speakers of English are welcome provided that they have a high level of English: CEFR Level C1.
- Good language awareness is essential.
- Candidates should be at least 18 years old for both courses.
- Following the initial application, all candidates are sent a pre-interview questionnaire and then interviewed personally by one of our Teacher Trainers who will assess their suitability to start the course. This will include a written task.

Courses for Overseas Teachers of English

St Giles also offers courses for non-native English language teachers, who wish to improve their English skills and develop their professional knowledge.

St Giles Teachers of English Course (TEC)

The St Giles TEC is a teacher development course for non-native teachers of English who want to improve their English.

Participants develop and explore aspects of teaching methodology and techniques, and learn to assess and utilise a variety of teaching aids and resources. There is no formal assessment, but participants can choose to prepare for the Cambridge TKT, as detailed below. At the end of the course, all participants receive a certificate of attendance and a St Giles Teachers of English Course Certificate.

The main elements of the course are:

- Language development
- Background to language learning and teaching
- Different methodologies for teaching
- Classroom management and practical teaching skills
- Lesson planning
- Teaching aids and resources
- Observation of experienced teachers

These courses are designed to be very flexible, and can be adapted to suit the specific needs of the participants. We can also arrange closed group courses for groups of teachers travelling together at any time of year.

Your level of English should be at least level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages to take part. (This is equivalent to FCE, IELTS 5, TOEFL computer-based score of 173)

Funding

Teachers from the EU enrolling on a St Giles TEC course or Cambridge ICALT course may be eligible for funding under the Comenius or Grundtvig schemes. The Comenius and Grundtvig programmes provide training grants for staff involved in school education to attend training courses of up to four weeks in length in participating European countries.

The deadlines for grant applications are far in advance of the course dates, so it is necessary to apply early. Those seeking this EU funding should contact their National Agency.

Cambridge TKT

The Cambridge TKT (Teaching Knowledge Test) is an award for English language teachers, testing professional knowledge. The test aims to increase teachers' confidence and enhance job prospects by focusing on the core teaching knowledge needed by teachers of primary, secondary or adult learners, anywhere in the world. The TKT can be taken at any stage in a teacher's career, and is also ideal for those who have not yet started teaching.

St Giles offers the TKT in conjunction with our TEC and ICALT Module One courses. Candidates choose the number of TKT modules they wish to prepare for before the start of their course, and then take the test(s) during the final week of their course. You will prepare for the tests through input sessions and directed study. The exam fee is the only additional charge.





Cambridge ICELT

ICELT (In-service Certificate in English Language Teaching) is a Cambridge award for practising teachers of English, which aims to deepen and develop candidates' teaching knowledge and expertise. Candidates must have at least an upper-intermediate (Level B2) of English, and should be practising teachers.

The programme is divided into two modules:

Module One

- **Component One: Language for Teachers**

Module One can only be completed either in the UK, or in the participants' home country. Module Two can only be completed in the candidates' home country, as the teachers' teaching context must be taken into account. St Giles offers the opportunity to complete all or part of the ICELT.



Module One: Language for Teachers

- **Component One: Language for Teachers**

Module One is a four-week intensive course, offered at St Giles Brighton. For this module, candidates are required to be practising teachers with a minimum of 100 hours' teaching experience. The module aims to develop teaching methodology, professional language and communication skills in English.

St Giles offers Module One for closed groups only. Teachers working at a single institution or group of institutions in the same geographical area can arrange the course at any suitable time of the year. A closed group needs to contact St Giles as a ready-formed group before arrangements can begin.

The course includes the following:

- Six assessed language tasks
- Teaching practice to aid completion of the language tasks
- Input sessions on professional language, methodology and practical teaching skills
- Optional preparation for Cambridge TKT

The course and assessment are moderated by Cambridge ESOL. Successful candidates are awarded the Cambridge Language for Teachers Certificate with a grade of Pass, Merit or Distinction.

Module Two: Teaching and Methodology

- **Component Three: Methodology**

Module Two must be taken in your home country, and therefore is offered by St Giles Brighton only for closed groups of teachers from one institution or group of institutions in the same geographical area.

It is possible for the group to take Module One in the UK and then take Module Two later in their home country; or to take both Modules in their home country. A closed group needs to contact St Giles as a ready-formed group before arrangements can begin.

The full course covers a period of six months, and combines face-to-face input at an approved site in the home country with some distance learning completed in the candidates' own time.

Candidates should be practising teachers with a minimum of 500 hours' teaching experience by the end of the course. During the course you will complete four Language for Teachers tasks, four assessed lessons and four written methodology assignments. The course is moderated by an external moderator, appointed by Cambridge ESOL.

Successful candidates are awarded the Cambridge ICELT Certificate with a grade of Pass, Merit, or Distinction.



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
