## **2011 School Performance Fact Sheet Frequently Asked Questions and Answers**

### **Q. What is the 2011 School Performance Fact Sheet?**

A. The 2011 School Performance Fact Sheet ( the "2011 SPFS") is a document that all private postsecondary and vocational schools in California including Truck Driver Institute (TDI) are required to provide to each prospective student. The 2011 SPFS discloses certain information relating to the employer or "placement" of TDI graduates.

### **Q. How is "Placement" defined?**

A. For purposes of the 2011 SPFS TDI considers graduates to be placed if they obtained full-time or part-time in a paid position after graduation in their field of study at TDI or in a related field, whether the placement was facilitated by TDI or not.

- Full-time: employment for at least five working days after graduation on a work schedule of 32 hours or more per week
- Part-time: employment for at least five working days after graduation on a work schedule of 15 hours or more per week. These jobs are often pro term (per diem)

To be considered employment in a related field, a student must be using at least 20% of their career program skills obtained through their education at TDI in their job duties. Essentially, employment in a related field involves the use of a material portion of a graduate's skills included in the graduate's program curriculum in a material portion of the graduate's employment duties.

TDI does not consider any graduate as having obtained employment for whom TDI does not possess evident, documented in the graduate's placement file, showing that the graduate obtained employment in an occupation for which TDI offered instruction to the graduate TDI only tracks the initial employment of graduates, not their continued employment status.

### **Q. What do the numbers under "Completion Rate" mean?**

A. Truck Driving program at TDI is 180 clock hours and the Bus Training 180 hours. For purposes of the 2011 SPFS, to "successfully complete", a student must graduate by completing the driver training and DMV testing of the program.

The statistics in the second column on the 2011 SPFS under the heading entitled "**Completion Rate**" are calculated by dividing the number of graduates (students who DID complete within that time period) by the number of all students that began a program on the start date.

The statistics in the fourth column on the 2011 SPFS under the heading entitled "**Completion Rate Based on 100%**" include students who graduated successfully in a session that ended later than they were originally scheduled to graduate.

The Bus training is a new program and data is not available at this time.

### **Q. Tell me about the Licensure/Examination Pass Rate.**

School programs that lead to employment for which passage of a state licensing examination is required are required by state law to annually report the license examination passage rates for the immediate preceding two years to the bureau and publish the passage rates in the SPFS.

These statistics are calculated by dividing the number of graduates who pass the examination by the number of graduates who take the licensing examination the first time that the examination is available after completion of the educational program.

The Bus Training is a new program and data is not available at this time.
