Completion Rates

Middlebury College's academic programs, at the Monterey Institute of International Studies, in California, do not enroll full-time, first time undergraduate students and thus do not report completion rates to IPEDS. Additionally, completion rates of graduate students are not required by IPEDS.

The overall graduation rate for students who began their studies in fall 2006 at Middlebury College's undergraduate program in Vermont is 94%*, as reported to IPEDS.

The overall graduation rate is also known as the "Student Right to Know" or IPEDS graduation rate. It tracks the progress of students who began their studies as full-time, first-time degree- or certificate-seeking students to see if they complete a degree or other award such as a certificate within 150% of "normal time" for completing the program in which they are enrolled.

Note that not all students at the institution are tracked for these rates. Students who have already attended another postsecondary institution, or who began their studies on a part-time basis, are not tracked for this rate. At Middlebury College in Vermont, 98 percent of entering students were counted as "full-time, first-time" in 2012.
