Graduates mean the number of students who complete a program within 100 percent of the published program length.

Graduates available for employment means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.

Graduates employed in the field means graduates who are gainfully employed within six months of graduation in a position for which the skills obtained through the education and training provided by the institution are required or provide a significant advantage to the graduate in obtaining the position.

Graduates unavailable for employment means graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education at an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.

A student available for graduation means the cohort population minus the number of students unavailable for graduation.

Students unavailable for graduation mean students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.
