### **California Labor Market and Economic Analysis - 2012**

From September 2009 through December 2011, job growth derived from seven industry sectors; of those, mining and logging, professional and business services, and educational and health services grew at the fastest pace. The trade, transportation and utilities (18.4 percent); government (16.6 percent); professional and business services (14.7 percent); and educational and health services (12.7 percent) industry sectors had the largest shares of payroll jobs across the state. The educational services (private) and health care and social assistance are two of the three industry sectors that will generate a majority of the non-farm job growth; collectively these two sectors are forecasted to add over 400,000 jobs by 2018.

Employment in the trade, transportation, and utilities; government; and professional and business services sectors each totaled more than 2 million jobs in 2011. Together, these three sectors accounted for half (49.8 percent) of California's jobs. Employment in three additional sectors – educational and health services, leisure and hospitality, and manufacturing – each totaled more than 1.2 million jobs. These three sectors combined comprised nearly one-third (31.9 percent) of overall employment. The remaining six industry sectors each had fewer than 800,000 jobs, and combined, accounted for less than one-fifth (18.3 percent) of the state's jobs.

Education Services: Average Weekly Pay: \$872.57; Average Annual Pay: \$45,374  
Private educational services and health care services were the fastest growing sectors in the population-serving segment of the economy over the two years ending in December 2011. In sharp contrast, budget-strapped state and local governments, which include public educational services, lost 61,300 jobs over the two-year period even as the rest of the economy was expanding. These losses were concentrated in local public education.

Private educational services and health care services were also the only two sectors in the California economy to expand their employment during the Great Recession. Employment growth in the private educational services sector occurred at the same time that job losses in public education mounted. Given the uncertain budget outlook of state and local governments, this trend will likely continue.

The numbers of working ESL Teachers in California is unknown because these workers are counted among English and Foreign Language Teachers, non-vocational education instructors in adult school

and Elementary and Secondary School Teachers. Nearly one in every four students in California's elementary, middle, and high schools speak limited English. These students, in turn, live with families where English is either not spoken or spoken at a limited level. This trend points to a growing need for trained professionals who can teach the English language to children and adults alike.

Teachers of ESL who have California teaching credentials and work in elementary or secondary schools earn wages that compare to regular Teacher salaries offered by school districts. Salaries for ESL Teachers who teach abroad vary depending on the country. The majority of ESL jobs in the U.S. are part-time and many are in adult education programs where ESL Teachers lead day and/or evening classes. Hours are based on time in the classroom; therefore, classroom preparation must be done on the ESL Teacher's own time.

Full-time jobs in the U.S. are usually in public and private schools. There are fewer of these positions and they are much more competitive, usually being filled by experienced ESL Teachers who have Master's degrees. Full-time positions are more common overseas. Full-time ESL Teachers in the U.S. usually receive benefit packages that include holidays and vacations, sick leave, health insurance, and retirement plans. Part-time workers are usually paid an hourly or daily rate but no benefits.

Positions for ESL teachers abroad often provide all of the benefits of a full-time ESL Teacher in the U.S. plus additional benefits. These include free housing or a housing allowance for local transportation, and paid travel for trips home once or twice a year. Employers may also give the ESL Teacher a bonus at the end of the contract.

It is estimated that over 1 billion people are currently learning English worldwide. According to the British Council, [http://esl.about.com/od/englishlearningresources/f/f\\_eslmarket.htm](http://esl.about.com/od/englishlearningresources/f/f_eslmarket.htm), as of the year 2,000 there were 750 million English as a Foreign language speakers. In addition, there were 375 million English as a Second Language speakers. The difference between the two groups amounts to English as a Foreign Language speakers using English occasionally for business or pleasure, while English as a Second Language speakers use English on a daily basis.
