**STATEMENT OF ISSUES**

17  
18 Complainant alleges:

19 **PARTIES**

20 1. Joanne Wenzel (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in her official  
21 capacity as the Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, Department of  
22 Consumer Affairs.

23 2. On or about May 14, 2013, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education received  
24 an Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate from Stella Adler Academy of Acting  
25 (Respondent and/or the Institution). On or about May 7, 2013, Stella Adler Academy of Acting  
26 certified under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers, and  
27 representations in the application. The Bureau denied the application on March 16, 2016. On or  
28 about July 8, 2016, the Bureau issued an amended notice of denial of the application.

1 **JURISDICTION**

2 3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of  
3 Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, under the  
4 authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Education Code unless  
5 otherwise indicated.

6 4. Code section 94886 states that:

7 Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in  
8 compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section  
9 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary  
10 educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this  
11 chapter.

12 5. Code section 94891 states that:

13 (a) The bureau shall adopt by regulation the process and procedures  
14 whereby an institution may obtain a renewal of an approval to operate.

15 (b) To be granted a renewal of an approval to operate, the institution shall  
16 demonstrate its continued capacity to meet the minimum operating standards.

17 (c)(1) An institution that is denied renewal of an approval to operate may  
18 file an appeal in accordance with the procedures established by the bureau pursuant to  
19 Section 94888.

20 (2) An institution that has filed an appeal of a denial of a renewal  
21 application may continue to operate during the appeal process, but must disclose in a  
22 written statement, approved by the bureau, to all current and prospective students,  
23 that the institution's application for renewal of approval to operate was denied by the  
24 bureau because the bureau determined the application did not satisfy the requirements  
25 to operate in California, that the institution is appealing the bureau's decision, and that  
26 the loss of the appeal may result in the institution's closure.

27 (3) If the bureau determines that the continued operation of the institution  
28 during the appeal process poses a significant risk of harm to students, the bureau shall  
make an emergency decision pursuant to its authority provided in Section 94938.

**STATUTORY PROVISIONS<sup>1</sup>**

6. Code section 94910 states, in pertinent part, as follows:

Except as provided in subdivision (d) of Section 94909 and Section  
94910.5, prior to enrollment, an institution shall provide a prospective student with a

<sup>1</sup>On October 11, 2009, the California Private Postsecondary Education Act (Act) of 2009  
was signed into law. (Educ. Code, §§94800, et seq.) The Act was recently amended, effective  
January 1, 2015. (See: Senate Bill No. 1247.) This Statement of Issues is based on the post-  
amendment version of the Act.

1 School Performance Fact Sheet containing, at a minimum, the following information,  
as it relates to the educational program:

2 (a) Completion rates, as calculated pursuant to Article 16 (commencing  
3 with Section 94928).

4 \* \* \* \*

5 (f) All of the following:

6 (1) A description of the manner in which the figures described in  
7 subdivisions (a) to (d), inclusive, are calculated or a statement informing the reader of  
8 where he or she may obtain a description of the manner in which the figures  
9 described in subdivisions (a) to (d), inclusive, are calculated.

10 (2) A statement informing the reader of where he or she may obtain from  
11 the institution a list of the employment positions determined to be within the field for  
12 which a student received education and training for the calculation of job placement  
13 rates as required by subdivision (b).

14 (3) A statement informing the reader of where he or she may obtain from  
15 the institution a list of the objective sources of information used to substantiate the  
16 salary disclosure as required by subdivision (d).

17 \* \* \* \*

18 7. Code section 94928, subdivision (c), states, in relevant part, that:

19 As used in this article, the following terms have the following meanings:

20 \* \* \* \*

21 (c) "On-time graduates" means the number of students who complete a  
22 program within 100 percent of the published program length. An institution may  
23 separately state completion information for students completing the program within  
24 150 percent of the original contracted time, but that information may not replace  
25 completion information for students completing within the original scheduled time.  
26 Completion information shall be separately stated for each campus or branch of the  
27 institution.

28 8. Code section 94929 provides, in pertinent part:

(a) An institution shall annually report to the bureau, as part of the annual  
report, and publish in its School Performance Fact Sheet, the completion rate for each  
program. Except as provided in subdivision (b), the completion rate shall be  
calculated by dividing the number of on-time graduates by the number of students  
available for graduation.

(b) In lieu of calculating graduation data pursuant to subdivision (a), an  
institution may report graduation data reported to, and calculated by, the Integrated  
Postsecondary Education Data System of the United States Department of Education.

9. Code section 94932 provides that:

The bureau shall determine an institution's compliance with the  
requirements of this chapter. The bureau shall have the power to require reports that  
institutions shall file with the bureau in addition to the annual report, to send staff to

1 an institution's sites, and to require documents and responses from an institution to  
2 monitor compliance. When the bureau has reason to believe that an institution may be  
3 out of compliance, it shall conduct an investigation of the institution. If the bureau  
4 determines, after completing an investigation, that an institution has violated any  
5 applicable law or regulation, the bureau shall take appropriate action pursuant to this  
6 article.

7 **REGULATORY PROVISIONS**

8 10. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71475, states, in pertinent part:

9 \* \* \* \*

10 (e) The institution shall submit at the time it applies for renewal current  
11 financial statements that meet the requirements of section 74115 as follows: (1) for an  
12 institution with annual gross revenues of \$500,000 and over, statements shall be  
13 audited; (2) for an institution with annual gross revenues less than \$500,000,  
14 statements shall be reviewed.

15 11. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71630, states:

16 (a) An institution seeking to change its name shall complete the "Change  
17 of Name" form (NAME rev. 2/10) to obtain prior authorization. The form shall be  
18 submitted to the Bureau along with the appropriate fee as provided in Section  
19 94930.5(c) of the Code. For an institution approved under section 94885 of the code it  
20 shall be signed and dated by the signatory(ies) required by section 71380, for an  
21 institution approved under section 94890 of the code it shall be signed and dated by  
22 the signatory(ies) required by section 71390, and each fact stated therein and each  
23 attachment thereto shall be declared to be true under penalty of perjury, in the  
24 following form:

25 "I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of  
26 California that the foregoing and all attachments are true and correct.

(b) The application shall include:

(1) The name, school code, address, and telephone and fax numbers of the  
institution;

(2) The proposed new name;

(3) A detailed explanation of the reasons for the proposed change in  
name;

(4) Copies of advertising and other statements to be disseminated to the  
public in any manner by the institution or its representatives that announce or use the  
proposed name;

(5) The name, address, email address, and telephone and fax numbers of  
the institution's contact person for the purpose of this application; and

(6) Any additional information required by the Bureau pursuant to section

1 71340.

2 (c) An institution that has been granted an approval to operate by means  
3 of accreditation shall notify the Bureau of the substantive change within 30 days of  
4 that change on the Change of Name form by completing section (b)(1) and (b)(5) of  
5 this section, and shall attach certification from the institution's accreditation agency  
6 demonstrating that the substantive change was made in accordance with the  
7 institution's accreditation standards, and complies with the Act and this Division.

8 12. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71700 states that "The Bureau may  
9 request that an institution document compliance with the standards set forth in the Act and this  
10 Division to obtain and maintain an approval to operate."

11 13. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71745, states as follows:

12 (a) The institution shall document that it has at all times sufficient assets  
13 and financial resources to do all of the following:

14 (5) Pay all operating expenses due within 30 days.

15 (6) Maintain a ratio of current assets to current liabilities of 1.25 to 1.00  
16 or greater at the end of the most recent fiscal year when using generally accepted  
17 accounting principles, or for an institution participating in Title IV of the federal  
18 Higher Education Act of 1965, meet the composite score requirements of the U.S.  
19 Department of Education. For the purposes of this section, current assets does not  
20 include: intangible assets, including goodwill, going concern value, organization  
21 expense, startup costs, long-term prepayment of deferred charges, and non-returnable  
22 deposits, or state or federal grant or loan funds that are not the property of the  
23 institution but are held for future disbursement for the benefit of students. Unearned  
24 tuition shall be accounted for in accordance with general accepted accounting  
25 principles.

26 14. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112, provides in relevant part<sup>2</sup>:

27 (c) Reporting periods:

28 (1) An Annual Report shall include data for all educational programs as  
defined in section 94837 of the Code for the previous one calendar year.

(2) A Performance Fact Sheet shall be current and available not later than  
August 1st, and shall report data for the previous two calendar years based upon the  
'number of students who began program' or the 'number of graduates,' as defined in  
subdivision (b), for each reported calendar year.

(d) Completion Rates. Reporting of completion rates for an institution's  
Annual Report and Performance Fact Sheet shall include, for each educational  
program, the number of students who began program as defined in subdivision (b),  
the number of students available for graduation, number of graduates, and completion  
rate(s). An optional column may be added to include completion rate data for students

<sup>2</sup> California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112 was amended at the end of July  
2016, after the Bureau's denial of Respondent's application. Therefore, the version of section  
74112 which was in effect at the time of the denial is being cited in this Statement of Issues.

1 completing within 101-150% of the published program length. For an institution  
 2 reporting completion data pursuant to section 94929(b) of the Code, completion data  
 3 shall be separately reported for each program. The Performance Fact Sheet shall  
 4 disclose, if true, that the completion data is being reported for students completing  
 5 within 150% of the published program length, and that data is not being separately  
 6 reported for students completing the program within 100% of the published program  
 7 length.

8 Completion rates shall be included in the Performance Fact Sheet in a  
 9 format substantially similar to the chart below, including the footnoted information  
 10 below (dates, numbers, and other data shown are for example only):

 12 reporting)

30 1 'Number of Students Who Began Program' is the number of students  
 31 who began the program who are scheduled to complete the program within the  
 32 reporting calendar year.

33 2 'Students available for graduation' is the number of students who began  
 34 program minus the number of 'Students unavailable for graduation,' which means  
 35 those students who have died, been incarcerated, or called to active military duty.

36 3 'Graduates' is the number of students who completed the program  
 37 within 100% of the published program length.

38 4 'Completion Rate' is the number of Graduates divided by the Number  
 39 of Students Available for Graduation.

40 5 '150% Graduates' is the number of students who completed the  
 41 program within 101-150% of the published program length.

42 6 '150% Completion Rate' is the number of students who completed the  
 43 program in the reported calendar year within 101-150% of the published program  
 44 length divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation in the published

1 program length period.

2 \* \* \* \*

3 (e) Placement Rates.

4 (1) Any placement data required by sections 94910(b) and 94929.5(a) of  
5 the Code shall be reported for the number of students who began the program as  
6 defined in subdivision (b) for each reported calendar year.

7 (2) Placement is measured six months from the graduation date of each  
8 student. Reporting of placement rates shall include for each educational program: the  
9 number of students who began the program, the number of graduates as defined in  
10 subdivision (b), graduates available for employment, graduates employed in the field  
11 and placement rate(s).

12 \* \* \* \*

13 (h) Documentation supporting all data reported shall be maintained by the  
14 institution for at least five years from the time included in either an Annual Report or  
15 a Performance Fact Sheet, and shall include at a minimum: student name(s), address,  
16 phone number, email address, program completed, program start and completion  
17 dates, place of employment and position, salary, hours, and a description of all  
18 attempts to contact each student. Documentation shall also include the name, email  
19 address, phone number, and position or title of the institution's representative who is  
20 primarily responsible for obtaining the students' completion, placement, licensing,  
21 and salary and wage data, the date that the information was gathered, and copies of  
22 notes, letters or emails through which the information was requested and gathered.

23 15. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115, states:

24 (a) This section applies to every set of financial statements required to be  
25 prepared or filed by the Act or by this chapter.

26 (b) A set of financial statements shall contain, at a minimum, a balance  
27 sheet, an income statement, and a cash flow statement, and the preparation of  
28 financial statements, shall comply with all of the following:

(1) Audited and reviewed financial statements shall be conducted and  
prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established  
by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants by an independent certified  
public accountant who is not an employee, officer, or corporate director or member of  
the governing board of the institution.

(2) Financial statements prepared on an annual basis as required by  
section 74110(b) shall be prepared in accordance with the generally accepted  
accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public  
Accountants. Nonprofit institutions shall provide annual financial statements as  
required under generally accepted accounting principles for nonprofit organizations.

(3) The financial statements shall establish that the institution meets the  
requirements for financial resources required by Section 71745.

(4) If an audit performed to determine compliance with any federal or  
state student financial aid program reveals any failure to comply with the

1 requirements of the program and the noncompliance creates any liability or potential  
2 liability for the institution, the financial statements shall reflect the liability or  
3 potential liability.

4 (5) Any audits shall demonstrate that the accountant obtained an  
5 understanding of the institution's internal financial control structure, assessed any  
6 risks, and has reported any material deficiencies in the internal controls.

7 (c) Work papers for the financial statements shall be retained for five  
8 years from the date of the statements and shall be made available to the Bureau upon  
9 request.

10 (d) "Current" with respect to financial statements means completed no  
11 sooner than 120 days prior to the time it is submitted to the Bureau, and covering no  
12 less than the most recent complete fiscal year. If more than 8 months will have  
13 elapsed between the close of the most recent complete fiscal year and the time it is  
14 submitted, the fiscal statements shall also cover no less than five months of that  
15 current fiscal year.

#### 16 **FACTUAL BACKGROUND**

17 16. On or about May 14, 2013, the Bureau received Application No. 26143, the  
18 "Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer Educational Programs for Non-  
19 Accredited Institutions" (application) from Respondent. Respondent submitted various  
20 documents with the application, including but not limited to a Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss  
21 year ending December 31, 2012 and the Institution's Catalog for 2012-2013.

22 17. On or about May 15, 2013, the Bureau sent a letter to Respondent acknowledging  
23 receipt of the Institution's application, stating that the application was found to be incomplete and  
24 requesting additional information and/or documents for the application to be deemed complete.

25 18. On or about November 30, 2015, the Bureau issued a deficiency letter to Respondent,  
26 which included deficiencies in various sections of the application, including but not limited to the  
27 Institution's financial resources and statements, School Performance Fact Sheet, Reporting of  
28 Student Performance Data, and Clarification of Institution's Name.

19 19. On or about December 21, 2015, the Institution sent a response to the Bureau which  
20 included additional documents, including but not limited to the Institution's Balance Sheet and  
21 Profit and Loss for year ending September 30, 2015, which was not reviewed or audited by a  
22 Certified Public Accountant (CPA), the School Performance Fact Sheet for 2016/2017, Student  
23 Performance Data for 2013/2014 and the Institution's Catalog for 2016. In addition, Articles of  
24 Incorporation for "Stella Adler Theatre" were included with this letter.





1 Adler Theatre”), enrollment agreements (i.e. “Stella Adler Los Angeles Academy of Acting and  
2 Theatre”), U.S. application (i.e. “Stella Adler – Los Angeles”), school catalog, School  
3 Performance Fact Sheets and advertising, in violation of California Code of Regulations, title 5,  
4 sections 71630. Respondent incorporates by reference herein Paragraphs 16-23, above.

5 **THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION**

6 **(School Performance Fact Sheet)**

7 26. Respondent’s application is subject to denial under Code section 94932, as follows:

8 a. Respondent reports in its School Performance Fact Sheet (SPFS) for 2013 that 31  
9 students were available for graduation, 31 students graduated and the Completion Rate is 57%.

10 The Completion Rate is incorrect and is not calculated in accordance with the provisions of  
11 California Code of Regulation, title 5, section 74112, subdivision (d).

12 b. Respondent violated Code sections 94910, subdivision (a), 94928, subdivision (c)  
13 and 94929, and California Code of Regulation, title 5, section 74112, subdivision (d), in that the  
14 Institution’s SPFS for 2014 does not include data for Students Available for Graduation,  
15 Graduates and Completion Rate. These were left blank by the Institution.

16 c. For the SPFS for 2013/2014, the Placement Rates do not include the definitions for  
17 footnote six - Graduates Employed in the Field an Average of less than 32 hours per week, and  
18 footnote seven - Graduates Employed in the Field at least 32 hours per week, in violation of  
19 California Code of Regulation, title 5, section 74112, subdivision (e).

20 d. Respondent failed to include in its SPFS a statement informing the reader where  
21 they may obtain from the institution a list of employment positions determined to be within the  
22 field for which a student received education and training for the calculation of job placement  
23 rates, in violation of Code section 94910, subdivision (f)(2).

24 e. Respondent failed to include in its SPFS a statement informing the reader of where  
25 he or she may obtain from the Institution a list of the objective sources of information used to  
26 substantiate the salary disclosure, in violation of Code section 94910, subdivision (f)(3).

27 f. In Respondent’s SPFS received on June 17, 2016, the tables for On-Time  
28 Completion Rates and Students Completing After Published Program Length (101-150%

1 Completion Rates) are confusing and labeled incorrectly. Also, the SPFS submitted incorrectly  
2 documents in the Institution's header for the reported years of 2016/2017. The correct reporting  
3 years should be for 2013/2014. Further, the fact sheet tables document the years 2014/2015. The  
4 reporting years should be for 2013/2014. This is a violation of Code sections 94910, subdivision  
5 (a), 94928, subdivision (c), 94929 and California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112,  
6 subdivision (d).

7 g. In Respondent's SPFS received on June 17, 2016, the Institution's header  
8 incorrectly documents the reported years of 2016/2017. The correct reporting years should be for  
9 2013/2014. Further, the fact sheet tables document the years 2014/2015, when the reporting years  
10 should be for 2013/2014. This is a violation of California Code of Regulations, title 5, section  
11 74112, subdivision (c)(2).

12 h. Respondent's SPFS received on June 17, 2016 documents the actual reporting  
13 years as 2014/2015. The 2013 reporting year is not documented on the fact sheet. This is a  
14 violation of California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112, subdivision (c)(2).

15 27. Respondent incorporates by reference herein Paragraphs 16-23, above.

16 **FOURTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION**

17 **(Student Performance Data)**

18 28. Respondent's application is subject to denial because the Student Performance  
19 Data which was submitted to the Bureau does not include all of the minimum requirements,  
20 pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112, subdivision (h). In particular,  
21 the supporting data does not include an explanation of the colored areas or abbreviations used.

22 29. Respondent incorporates by reference herein Paragraphs 16-23, above.

23 **PRAYER**

24 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,  
25 and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a  
26 decision:

27 1. Denying the application of Stella Adler Academy of Acting for an Application for  
28 Renewal of Approval to Operate, Institution Code No. 1919351; and

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2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
