20	PARTIES	
21	1. Complainant brings this statement of issues solely in her official capacity as the Chief	
22	of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (Bureau), Department of Consumer Affairs.	
23	2. On or about September 30, 2011, the Bureau received an Application for Approval to	
24	Operate for an Institution Non Accredited, School Code Application Number 23983 (Application	
25	#23983) for International University of North America (International University); respondent	
26	Narender Ramarapu, Chief Executive Officer. On or about February 16, 2012, respondent	
27	certified under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers, and

representations in Application #23983. The Bureau denied Application #23983 on January 9, 2013.

JURISDICTION

- 3. This statement of issues is brought before the Director of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau under the authority of the following laws.
 - 4. Education Code section 94886 states:

"Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter."

5. Education Code section 94887 states:

"An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented sufficient evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the information provided by the applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant has the capacity to satisfy the minimum operating standards. The bureau shall deny an application for an approval to operate if the application does not satisfy those standards."

6. Education Code section 94932 states:

"The bureau shall determine an institution's compliance with the requirements of this chapter. The bureau shall have the power to require reports that institutions shall file with the bureau in addition to the annual report, to send staff to an institution's sites, and to require documents and responses from an institution to monitor compliance. When the bureau has reason to believe that an institution may be out of compliance, it shall conduct an investigation of the institution. If the bureau determines, after completing an investigation, that an institution has violated any applicable law or regulation, the bureau shall take appropriate action pursuant to this article."

STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

7. Business and Professions Code section 480 states, in pertinent part:

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denial of a license under Section 480 of the Business and Professions Code, incorporated herein by reference."

11. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 75060, states, in pertinent part:

"In determining whether any of the grounds for denial set forth in Section 480 of the Business and Professions Code exist, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of any owner, corporate director or member of the governing board, officer, or administrator under any of the following circumstances:

- "(a) The crime or act involves any violation of the Act or this chapter, Title IV of the federal Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. § 1070, et seq.), the closure of an institution, fraud or misrepresentation, breach of fiduciary duty, any type of forgery or theft, or any type of dishonesty causing any financial loss.
- "(b) The crime, to a substantial degree, evidences present or potential unfitness to perform the functions and duties authorized or required by the Act or this chapter in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare, including a crime prohibited by Title 8 (commencing with Section 187) or Title 9 (commencing with Section 261) of the Penal Code."

FACTUAL BACKGROUND

- 12. On September 30, 2011, the Bureau received Application #23983 from respondent. On February 16, 2012, respondent signed under penalty of perjury that Application #23983 and its attachments were true and correct.
- 13. On July 10, 2012, the Bureau requested additional information from respondent to support Application #23983, including the faculty members list of teaching assignments for all courses. On July 24, 2012, respondent sent the Bureau a list of faculty and consulting professors. Respondent claimed that International University "has a relationship with the following faculty and all have tentatively agreed to come on board as faculty upon [the Bureau's] approval of the

As set forth in paragraphs 12-17 above, respondent included Dr. 3 Crow in International University's list of faculty without Dr. Crow's consent. PRAYER WHEREFORE, complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged in this 6 statement of issues, and that following the hearing, the Director of Consumer Affairs issues a 7 decision: 1. Denying respondent International University of North America's Application for 9 Approval to Operate for an Institution Non Accredited, School Code Application Number 23983; 10 2.
