21	1. Dr. Michael Marion, Jr. (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in his
22	official capacity as the Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, Department of

23	Consumer Affairs.
24	2. On or about July 29, 2016, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education received
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25	an application for Approval to Operate an Institution Non-Accredited from Viridis Graduate
26	Institute (Respondent). On or about July 14, 2016, Lori Pye, as president, certified under penalty

27	of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers, and representations in the application.
28	The Bureau denied the application on February 21, 2017.

JURISDICTION

- This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Education Code unless otherwise indicated.
 Education Code section 94812 states:
 - "Academic year" means a period, including a minimum of 30 weeks of instructional time, in which a full-time student attending an institution that measures educational program length in credit hours completes 24 semester or trimester hours or 36 quarter hours, or an institution that measures educational program length in clock hours completes at least 900 clock hours.
 - 5. Education Code section 94846 states:

"Instruction" means an institution's specific, formal arrangements in which its faculty present a part of the curriculum.

- 6. Education Code section 94885! states:
- (a) The bureau shall adopt by regulation minimum operating standards for an institution that shall reasonably ensure that all of the following occur:
- (1) The content of each educational program can achieve its stated objective.
 - (5) The directors, administrators, and faculty are properly qualified.
- 7. Education Code Section 94886 states:

Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter.

8. Education Code Section 94887 states:

An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented sufficient evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the information provided by the applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant has the capacity to satisfy the minimum

4	9. Title 5, CCR, section 70000 states in pertinent part:
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6	(w) "Quarter unit" means either of the following:
7	(1) At least ten (10) hours of college or university level instruction during a quarter plus a reasonable period of time outside of instruction which an
8	institution requires a student to devote to preparation for planned learning experiences, such as preparation for instruction, study of course material, or
	completion of educational projects; or
10	(2) Planned learning experiences equivalent to the learning and preparation described in paragraph (1) as determined by duly qualified faculty responsible for evaluating learning outcomes for the award of unit credits.

13	10. Title 5, CCR, section 71700 states:
14	"The Bureau may request that an institution document compliance with
15	the standards set forth in the Act and this Division to obtain and maintain an approval to operate."
16	11. Title 5, CCR, section 71710 states:
17 18	In order to meet its mission and objectives, the educational program defined in section 94837 of the Code shall be comprised of a curriculum that includes:
19	(a) Those subject areas that are necessary for a student to achieve the educational objectives of the educational program in which the student is enrolled;
20 21	(b) Subject areas and courses or modules that are presented in a logically organized manner or sequence to students;
22	(c) Course or module materials that are designed or organized by duly
23	qualified faculty. For each course or module, each student shall be provided with a syllabus or course outline that contains:
24	(1) A short, descriptive title of the educational program;
25	(2) A statement of educational objectives;
26	(3) Length of the educational program;
27	(4) Sequence and frequency of lessons or class sessions;
28	(5) Complete citations of textbooks and other required written materials;
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via a distance learning platform, plus a reasonable period of time outside of instruction for each of the courses. The reasons include, but are not limited to non-functioning video hyperlinks, YouTube Video(s) that require additional payment to view and/or there are insufficient hours of instruction described in the syllabus. The applicable deficient courses include, but are not limited to the following:

MASTER of ARTS DEGREE · YEAR 1:

- EEHUM 501: Ecopsychology I;
- EEHUM 502: Ecopsychology II;
- EEHUM 601: Climate Change & Society;

MASTER of ARTS DEGREE YEAR 2:

- EEHUM 601: Climate Change & Society
- EEHUM 605: Thesis Project Formulation

SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards - Educational Programs)

- 17. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code sections 94885 subdivision (a)(1), 94812, 94886 and 94887 and California Code of Regulations, title 5, division 7.5, sections 71710 and 71865 subdivision (b) in that the institution has not met minimum operating standards where the institution has not demonstrated that the contents of its educational program(s) can achieve its stated objective as follows:
- 18. The courses on the OCEANS learning management platform are listed in a confusing manner and are not selectable. For example, when searching for course EEHUM 706, on the OCEANS learning management platform, two different unrelated titles for the course appear as: "The Practice of Ecopsychology, Facilitating Change" and "Mythology, Religion and Philosophy"
- 19. The institution did not accurately document its ability to provide the minimum amount of instruction required in a full academic quarter year in order to award a Doctor of Arts degree. The Doctor of Arts degree requires a minimum of 108 quarter units, however the program proposed by the institution has a total of 63 quarter units.

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THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards - Faculty)

- 20. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code sections 94885 (a)(5), 94886 and 94887 and California Code of Regulations, title 5, division 7.5, section 71720 subdivision (a) in that the institution does not satisfy the legally required minimum operating standards for faculty where the institution has not shown that its faculty members are qualified to perform the duties to which the faculty members were assigned, including providing instruction for its graduate degree programs, as set forth more specifically below:
- 21. Faculty member AV is proposed to serve as the co-instructor for the Doctorate of Arts course EEHUM 708 Business Ecologies. However, AV is not eligible to teach this Doctorate program without having attained an approved Doctorate degree.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- 1. Denying the application of Viridis Graduate Institute for Approval to Operate an Institution Non-Accredited;
 - 2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
