



NOTICE OF INTENT TO READOPT EMERGENCY REGULATIONS

This notice is sent in accordance with Government Code §11346.1(a)(2) and Title 1, California Code of Regulations (CCR) §52, which require State of California agencies to give a five (5) working day advance notice of intent to readopt emergency regulations with the Office of Administrative Law (OAL). The Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (BPPE) intends to file a request for readoption of regulations regarding Bureau Administration, Definitions, Applications, Institutional Operating Standards, General Provisions and Student Tuition Recovery Fund, originally approved by OAL on February 1, 2010, and which became effective February 1, 2010.

Pursuant to Title 1, CCR §52(b)(1), the BPPE has made substantial progress and proceeded with diligence to comply with Government Code §11346.1(e) by undertaking the following rulemaking activities:

- On April 23, 2010, the BPPE had OAL publish the Notice of Proposed Action for the above-described regulations in the *California Regulatory Notice Register*. The BPPE posted all required rulemaking materials on its Web site and mailed the notice to the BPPE's interested parties list.
- On June 7, 2010, The BPPE conducted a regulation hearing on the regulations regarding Bureau Administration, Definitions, Applications, Institutional Operating Standards, General Provisions and Student Tuition Recovery Fund.
- California Education Code section 94803 mandates the emergency regulations be made permanent within one year of enactment. Accordingly, the BPPE will be issuing the notice of modified text later in July.

As required by Title 1, CCR §52 there have been no changes in emergency circumstances since the original adoption of the regulations regarding Bureau Administration, Definitions, Applications, Institutional Operating Standards, General Provisions and Student Tuition Recovery Fund by OAL.

The BPPE hereby incorporates by reference the rulemaking record OAL file number 2010-0122-02E

The BPPE plans to file the readoption of the regulation package regarding Bureau Administration, Definitions, Applications, Institutional Operating Standards, General Provisions and Student Tuition Recovery Fund with OAL at least five working days from the date of this notice. If you would like to make comments on the readoption of the these named regulations, they must be received by both the BPPE and OAL within five calendar days of the BPPE's filing at OAL. Responding to the comments at this point in the process is strictly at the BPPE's discretion.
