If you withdraw from the course of instruction after the period allowed for cancellation, the school will remit a refund, less any non-refundable fees, within 45 days following your withdrawal. You are obligated to pay only for educational services rendered (including unexcused absence) and for unreturned books or equipment. For the purpose of determining a refund, a student shall be deemed to have withdrawn from a program of instruction when any of the following occurs:

- The student notifies the institution of the student's withdrawal or as of the date of the student's withdrawal, whichever is later.
- The institution terminates the student's enrollment for failure to maintain satisfactory progress; failure to abide by the rules and regulations of the institution; absences in excess of maximum set forth by the institution; and/or failure to meet financial obligations to the School.
- The student has failed to attend class for 3 classes without prior approval.

For the purpose of determining the amount of the refund, the date of the student's withdrawal shall be deemed the last date of recorded attendance.
