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## SCHOOL PERFORMANCE FACT SHEET 2013-2014

### Program Descriptions

#### **Nurse Assistant Training Program – 150 hours**

This course prepares the Nurse Assistant Student for the State of California Nursing Assistant Competency Evaluation. Certification is after satisfactory completion of the course program and passing of the CA State Exam. This precertification nurse assistant course is designed to train students to perform basic patient care services in licensed health care facilities directed at the safety, comfort, personal hygiene, and protecting of patients.

The course consists of 50 classroom hours of training on basic nursing skills, patient safety and rights, and the social and psychological problems of patients and 100 hours of supervised clinical practice at the onsite nursing facility.

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will be eligible to take the Department of Health Services Certification Nurse Assistant Examination. Upon successful completion of the examination, a student may become a Certified Nurse Assistant.

<sup>9</sup> "Placement Rate % Employment in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

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## 94910. Minimum Requirements for School Performance Fact Sheet

Prior to enrollment, an institution shall provide a prospective student with a School Performance Fact Sheet containing, at a minimum, the following information, as it relates to the educational program:

- (a) Completion rates, as calculated pursuant to Article 16 (commencing with Section 94928).
- (b) Placement rates, as calculated pursuant to Article 16 (commencing with Section 94928), if the educational program is designed to lead to, or the institution makes any express or implied claim related to preparing students for, a particular career, occupation, vocation, job, or job title.
- (c) License examination passage rates for programs leading to employment for which passage of a state licensing examination is required, as calculated pursuant to Article 16 (commencing with Section 94928).
- (d) (1) Salary or wage information, as calculated pursuant to Article 16 (commencing with Section 94928), if the institution or a representative of the institution makes any express or implied claim about the salary that may be earned after completing the educational program.  
(2) Additionally, each institution that offers an educational program designed to lead to a particular career, occupation, vocation, trade, job, or job title shall disclose the wage and Salary data for the particular career, occupation, trade, job, or job title, as provided by the Employment Development Department's Occupational Employment Statistics, if that data is available.
- (e) If a program is too new to provide data for any of the categories listed in this subdivision, the institution shall state on its fact sheet: "This program is new. Therefore, the number of students who graduate, the number of students who are placed, or the starting salary you can earn after finishing the educational program are unknown at this time.
