- 4. On or about December 11, 2012, the Bureau received an Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer Educational Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions from Respondent. On various dates in November and December 2012, Respondent's board members certified under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of all statements, answers, and representations in the application. The Bureau denied the application on or about March 7, 2016.

5. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Education Code¹ unless otherwise indicated.

6. Section 118, subdivision (b) of the Business and Professions Code provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Director of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

- 7. Section 94891, subdivision (b) of the Code states: "To be granted a renewal of an approval to operate, the institution shall demonstrate its continued capacity to meet the minimum operating standards."
 - 8. Section 94910 of the Code provides, in pertinent part:

"Prior to enrollment, an institution shall provide a prospective student with a School Performance Fact Sheet containing, at a minimum, the following information, as it relates to the educational program:

"(f) All of the following:

"(2) A statement informing the reader of where he or she may obtain from the institution a list of the employment positions determined to be within the field for which a student received education and training for the calculation of job placement rates as required by subdivision (b).

institution participating in Title IV of the federal Higher Education Act of 1965, meet the composite score requirements of the U.S. Department of Education. For the purposes of this section, current assets does not include: intangible assets, including goodwill, going concern value, organization expense, startup costs, long-term prepayment of deferred charges, and nonreturnable deposits, or state or federal grant or loan funds that are not the property of the institution but are held for future disbursement for the benefit of students. Unearned tuition shall be accounted for in accordance with general accepted accounting principles.

. . . , ,

California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74112, subdivision (a) states: 13.

"Format. The format for the Performance Fact Sheet shall be in at least 12 pt. type, in an easily readable font, with 1.15 line spacing and all titles and column headings shall be in bold 14 pt. type, which shall also identify the program for which the Performance Fact Sheet pertains. The Performance Fact Sheet shall contain all and only the information required or specifically permitted by sections 94910 and 94929.5 of the Code or this chapter. A separate Performance Fact Sheet shall be prepared for each program."

- California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 74115 provides, in pertinent part:
- "(a) This section applies to every set of financial statements required to be prepared or filed by the Act or by this chapter.
- "(b) A set of financial statements shall contain, at a minimum, a balance sheet, an income statement, and a cash flow statement, and the preparation of financial statements, shall comply with all of the following:

"(3) The financial statements shall establish that the institution meets the requirements for financial resources required by Section 71745.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Maintain Sufficient Assets and Financial Resources to Pay Operating Expenses)

15. Respondent's application is subject to denial under California Code of Regulations, title 5, sections 71475, subdivision (e), 71745, subdivision (a)(5), and 74115, subdivision (b)(3), in that Respondent failed to document that it has sufficient assets and financial resources to pay all operating expenses due within 30 days.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Maintain Adequate Ratio of Current Assets to Current Liabilities)

16. Respondent's application is subject to denial under California Code of Regulations, title 5, sections 71475, subdivision (e), 71745, subdivision (a)(6), and 74115, subdivision (b)(3), in that the financial statements Respondent submitted with its renewal application failed to show that Respondent has sufficient assets and financial resources to maintain a ratio of current assets to current liabilities of 1.25 to 1.00 or greater at the end of the most recent fiscal year.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Inadequate School Performance Fact Sheet)

17. Respondent's application is subject to denial under sections 94891, subdivision (b) and 94910, subdivision (f)(2) of the Code, and California Code of Regulations, title 5, sections 71700 and 74112, subdivision (a), in that the statement in Respondent's School Performance Fact Sheets informing the reader of where he or she may obtain from Respondent a list of the employment positions determined to be within the field for which a student received education and training for the calculation of job placement rates contains an incorrect website.

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Inadequate Website)

18. Respondent's application is subject to denial under section 94913, subdivision (a)(2) of the Code and California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71475, subdivision (c)(1), in that Respondent's website does not contain current and corrected School Performance Fact Sheets for each educational program Respondent offers.

PRAYER WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a decision: 1. Denying the Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer Educational Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions submitted by California Human Development Corporation; 2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
