(3) Based upon the most credible and verifiable data available.

(4) Does not impose undue compliance burdens on an institution.

(c) Data and information disclosed pursuant to paragraphs (1) to (3), inclusive, of

subdivision (d) of Section 94909, but an institution shall disclose on its fact sheet and to the

operating officer, and chief academic officer and describe their education, experience, and
qualifications to perform their duties and responsibilities. If there have been no substantive
changes since the last submission, the institution may so state and is not required to submit
documentation.

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14. Title 5, CCR, section 71730 states in part:

(e) The chief academic officer shall possess a degree or equivalent acceptable experience at
least equal to the highest qualifications required of the institution's faculty. Chief academic
officers employed on the date of implementation of these regulations, who do not meet the
qualifications for their positions, shall have three years to earn the necessary degrees or
experience to qualify them for their position.

13	institution but are held for future disbursement for the benefit of students. Unearned tuition shall
14	be accounted for in accordance with general accepted accounting principles.
15	(b) At an institution's request, the Bureau may consider the financial resources of a parent
16	company if the parent company, as defined by section 94853 of the Code, meets and maintains all
17	of the following provisions:
18	(1) consents in writing to be sued in California;
19	(2) consents in writing to be subject to the jurisdiction of the Bureau with respect to the
20	institution's regulation under the Act and this Chapter;
21	(3) designates and maintains an agent for service of process, consistent with section 74190

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c. The catalog does not include a complete statement indicating the Respondent's status. The catalog stated that the institution does not have a pending petition in bankruptcy, however it did not address whether it is operating as a debtor in possession, has filed a petition within the proceeding five years or has had a petition in bankruptcy filed against it within the proceeding five years that resulted in reorganization under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code.

d. The catalog does not include the types of equipment and materials that will be used
for instruction for the Home Health Aide and Certified Nurse Assistant programs.

e. The catalog does not contain policies regarding the acceptance of credits earned at
other institutions or through challenge examinations and achievement tests.

f. The catalog does not include a list of all charges for the entire program consistent
with the list of charges identified on the enrollment agreement.

g. The catalog does not include required verbatim language related to the Student
Tuition Recovery Fund.

h. The catalog includes contradictory statements regarding the cancelation policy. It
states that the institution will refund the amount paid for institutional charges less the nonrefundable registration fee, however the catalog also includes a refund policy stating: "There will
be no refunds of fee monies for students dismissed due to a violation of the Code of Conduct."
This refund policy is not compliant and contradicts the cancelation and withdrawal policy
described in the catalog.

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i. The catalog does not include probation policies.

j. The catalog does not describe the availability of housing located reasonably near the
Respondent's facilities and an estimation of the cost or range of cost of the housing.
