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# APPEAL OF CITATION INFORMAL CONFERENCE DECISION: CITATION AFFIRMED

On April 11, 2019, an informal telephone conference was held in the matter of Citation: Assessment of Fine and Order of Abatement No. 1819132 (Citation) against Chase Frazier, Owner of Champion Steno, LLC. In attendance were Yvette Johnson, Enforcement Chief; and Chase Frazier, Owner.

Pursuant to Business and Professions Code, §148; California Education Code (CEC), section 94944; and Title 5 of California Code of Regulations (5, CCR), section 75020 and section 75040, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education (Bureau) renders the following decision relative to your appeal of the Citation No. 1819132.

It is the decision of the Enforcement Chief that on May 7, 2019, Citation No. 1819132 is affirmed for the following reason(s):

No new substantive facts were presented at the conference.

#### **VIOLATION CODE SECTIONS**

# Below you will find the California Education Code (CEC) and/or Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations (5, CCR code) section(s) of law you are charged with violating.

1. | CEC Section 94886. Approval to Operate Required

"Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter."

CEC Section 94817.5. Approved to Operate or Approved

"Approved to operate" or "approved" means that an institution has received authorization pursuant to this chapter to offer to the public and to provide postsecondary educational programs."

## CEC Section 94868. To Offer to the Public

"To offer to the public" means to advertise, publicize, solicit, or recruit."

# CEC Section 94869. To Operate

"To operate" means to establish, keep, or maintain any facility or location in this state where, or from which, or through which, postsecondary educational programs are provided."

On June 8, 2018, Bureau staff reviewed the Institution's website at www. Chamionsteno.com, and confirmed that the Institution is offering an online course, "Court Reporting program", and charging \$7,176 to \$10,764. The Institution offers only online courses; however, their headquarters are located at 39855 Tanager Trail, Murrieta, CA 92562.

As of February 28, 2019, the Institution continues to operate without Bureau approval. The Institution does not qualify for any exemptions under CEC section 94874 and therefore requires the Bureau's approval to operate pursuant to CEC section 94886.

#### Order of Abatement:

The Bureau orders that the Institution cease to operate as a private postsecondary educational institution. The Institution must discontinue recruiting or enrolling students and cease all instructional services and advertising in any form or type of media, including www.championsteno.com and any other websites not identified here that are associated with the Institution, until such time as an approval to operate is obtained from the Bureau. The Institution must disconnect all telephone service numbers that are associated with the Institution until such time as an approval to operate is obtained from the Bureau. To comply with the Order of Abatement the Institution must submit a school closure plan to the Bureau pursuant to California Education Code section 94926. The Institution must provide a roster of each student currently enrolled at the Institution. The roster must include the names of the students, their contact information (including phone number, email address, and physical address), the programs in which they are enrolled, the amount paid for the programs.

#### Assessment of Fine

The fine for this violation is \$75,000.00

# ORDER OF ABATEMENT

The Bureau orders that you comply with the orders described in the 'Violation Code Sections' of this document and submit evidence of compliance within <u>30 days</u> from the date of this decision.

### APPEAL OF CITATION

You do not have the right to request another Informal Conference to appeal this affirmed Citation. You do, however, have the right to appeal this affirmed Citation through an Administrative Hearing. A hearing before an Administrative Law Judge will be scheduled and you will be notified of the hearing date. The hearing will be held pursuant to Chapter 5 (commencing with section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

If you do not wish to appeal this affirmed Citation you must withdraw your initial request for an Administrative Hearing. Please complete and mail the enclosed <u>Withdrawal - Request for Administrative Hearing</u> within <u>30 Days</u> of the date of this decision.

# EFFECTIVE DATE OF CITATION AND FINE ASSESSMENT

This affirmed Citation is effective on May 15, 2019. The order of abatement and payment are due by **June 14, 2019**.

Failure to abate the violation or to pay the administrative fine within the time allowed is grounds for denial of an application for an approval to operate or discipline. The Bureau will promptly take all appropriate action to enforce the affirmed Citation and recover the civil penalties prescribed therein or found to be due after a hearing.
