1	CEC § 94909 (a)(3)(D)	Violation Description: The institution's 2023 catalog, failed to contain the required verbatim statement: "The Office of Student Assistance and Relief is available to support prospective students, current students, or past students of private postsecondary educational institutions in making informed decisions, understanding their rights, and navigating available services and relief options. The office may be reached by calling (888) 370-7589 or by visiting https://www.osar.bppe.ca.gov/ ." Correction: The institution shall update the catalog, to include the above-mentioned statement, pursuant to CEC § 94909 (a)(3)(D).

Correction: The institution shall either provide proof of the documentation submitted to the Bureau's Licensing Unit for the approval to update the total hours for the Emergency Medical Technician to 204 hours. If a written notice of disagreement is not timely filed with the Bureau, the right to appeal is deemed to have been waived.

Pursuant to CEC section 94935(h), failure to comply with the notice to comply will result in the Bureau taking appropriate administrative enforcement action.
