1	CEC § 94897 (q)	Violation Description: The institution's website (https://yosan.edu/programs/doctorate-in-acupuncture-transition-program/) contains a false/misleading statement that implies the institution is approved to provide a First Professional Doctorate (DAcCHM) – One year (315 Hours) online degree program. However, according to Bureau records, the institution is not approved to teach this program. Correction: The institution shall either provide proof of the documentation submitted to the Bureau's Licensing Unit for the approval to teach in the 315 hour First Professional Doctorate (DAcCHM) program. Otherwise, if the institution did not receive approval from the Bureau to teach this program, the institution shall remove the statement from the website and contact the Bureaus Licensing Unit at BPPE.Licensing@dca.ca.gov for information and requirements to provide this program.

		On page 18 of the DAOM catalog, "On being accepted into the DAOM program, an international applicant must commit to full-time enrollment in the program by submitting a non-refundable deposit of \$2,000 (in U.S. dollars), which will be applied to the first trimester tuition."
		On page 20 of the MAcCHM/DAcCHM catalog, "On being accepted into the DAOM program, an international applicant must commit to full-time enrollment in the program by submitting a non-refundable deposit of \$2,000 (in U.S. dollars), which will be applied to the first trimester tuition."
		If these fees are paid directly to the institution, the fee is an institutional charge and cannot be non-refundable during the cancellation period. The cancellation policy includes the first day of instruction, or the 7th day after signing the enrollment agreement, whichever is later. If students sign the enrollment agreement on the course start date, they have the right to cancel within 7 days.
		Correction: The institution shall update its catalogs to specify the institution will NOT withhold institutional charges exceeding \$250 if cancellation is made through the 1 st class session or the 7 th day after enrollment, whichever is later.

- (1) Within 30 days from the date of the inspection, sign and return the notice to comply, declaring under penalty of perjury that the violation was corrected and describing how compliance was achieved; or
- (2) Within 30 days from the date of the inspection, file with the Bureau a written notice of disagreement, specifying the minor violations described in the notice to comply with which the person approved to operate the institution disagrees, and appealing it by requesting an informal office conference. If a written notice of disagreement is not timely filed with the Bureau, the right to appeal is deemed to have been waived.

Pursuant to CEC section 94935(h), failure to comply with the notice to comply will result in the Bureau taking appropriate administrative enforcement action.
