9	7. Section 94886 states:
10	"Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with
11	the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open,
12	conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without
13	obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter."
14	8. Section 94887 states:
15	"An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented sufficient
16	evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the information provided by the
17	applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant
18	has the capacity to satisfy the minimum operating standards. The bureau shall deny an application
19	for an approval to operate if the application does not satisfy those standards."
20	9. Section 94891 states, in part:

26	accordance with the procedures established by the bureau pursuant to Section 94888.
27	"(2) An institution that has filed an appeal of a denial of a renewal application may continue
28	to operate during the appeal process, but must disclose in a written statement, approved by the

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1	bureau, to all current and prospective students, that the institution's application for renewal of
2	approval to operate was denied by the bureau because the bureau determined the application did
3	not satisfy the requirements to operate in California, that the institution is appealing the bureau's
4	decision, and that the loss of the appeal may result in the institution's closure.
5	"
6	STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

14	pursuant to the applicable federal and state financial aid programs.

16	"(15) The following statement:
17	"NOTICE CONCERNING TRANSFERABILITY OF CREDITS AND CREDENTIALS
18	EARNED AT OUR INSTITUTION
19	"The transferability of credits you earn at (name of institution) is at the complete discretion
20	of an institution to which you may seek to transfer. Acceptance of the (degree, diploma, or
21	certificate) you earn in (name of educational program) is also at the complete discretion of the
22	institution to which you may seek to transfer. If the (credits or degree, diploma, or certificate) that
23	you earn at this institution are not accepted at the institution to which you seek to transfer, you
24	may be required to repeat some or all of your coursework at that institution. For this reason you
25	should make certain that your attendance at this institution will meet your educational goals. This
26	may include contacting an institution to which you may seek to transfer after attending (name of
27	institution) to determine if your (credits or degree, diploma, or certificate) will transfer.'
28
