Business and Professions Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Abate Violations)

- 10. Respondent's Approval to Operate is subject to disciplinary action under California Code of Regulation, title 5, section 75050, subdivision (b) in that Respondent failed to comply with Orders of Abatement and pay administrative fines, as follows:
- a. On or around December 12, 2019, the Bureau issued Citation 1920157 to Respondent for failing to submit the 2017 Annual Report, the Student Tuition Recovery Fund (STRF) reporting forms for the second and third quarters of 2019, and the 2019 Annual Fee and late payment penalty fee. Pursuant to the Order of Abatement in Citation 1920157, Respondent was required to submit all overdue items. Citation 1920157 also required payment of an administrative fine in the amount of \$5,050.00. On or around March 16, 2021, the Bureau received payment of the administrative fine. However, despite multiple letters requesting compliance with the outstanding Order of Abatement, Respondent has, to date, not complied.
- b. On or around September 17, 2020, the Bureau issued Citation 2021085 to Respondent for failing to submit the STRF reporting forms for the fourth quarter of 2019, failing to submit the SRTF forms for the first and second quarters of 2020, and failing to have personnel present during normal business hours. Pursuant to the Order of Abatement in Citation 2021085, Respondent submitted all overdue items as well as evidence of an established policy or procedure requiring personnel to be present during normal business hours. Citation 2021085 also required payment of an administrative fine in the amount of \$5050.00. The Bureau agreed to a three-month payment plan for the payment of the administrative fine of which \$1,550.0 has been paid. To date, a total balance of \$3,500.00 remains outstanding.
