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institution. Bruce Kelling, whose address was 4075 Rosenda Court, #276, San Diego, CA, 92122, was designated as the institution's contact person in the application.

- 3. On or about November 13, 2013, the Bureau was advised of a new address for Bruce Kelling, which is 2802 Chauncey Drive, San Diego, CA 92123.
- 4. On or about April 17, 2015, the Bureau issued a letter denying Respondent's application for an approval to operate. On or about April 23, 2015, Respondent appealed the Bureau's denial of their application and requested a hearing.
- 5. On or about December 16, 2015, an employee of the Department of Justice, served by Certified and First Class Mail a copy of the Statement of Issues No. 1000737, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7 to the addresses on the application form and to addresses subsequently provided by Respondent to the Bureau, which were: (1) Bruce Kelling, 2802 Chauncey Drive San Diego, CA 92123, and 4075 Rosenda Court, #276, San Diego, CA 92122; (2) Dincer Karaca, No:12/3 K:1 34734 Sahrayicedid, Istanbul, Turkey; and, (3) Hasbiye Uzgoren, 586 Anita Street, Chula Vista, CA 91911, and 1876 Sokak #17 D4, Izmir, Turkey. A signed returned receipt was received for service of the Statement of Issues on Bruce Kelling at 2802 Chauncey Drive, San Diego, CA. A copy of the Statement of Issues is attached as exhibit A, and is incorporated herein by reference.
- 6. Service of the Statement of Issues was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c).
- 7. On or about April 23, 2015, Respondent appealed the denial of their application and requested a hearing in this action. A Notice of Hearing was served by mail to the addresses on the application form and to addresses subsequently provided by Respondent, which were: (1) Bruce Kelling, 2802 Chauncey Drive San Diego, CA 92123, (2) Dincer Karaca, No:12/3 K:1 34734 Sahrayicedid, Istanbul, Turkey; and, (3) Hasbiye Uzgoren, 586 Anita Street, Chula Vista, CA 91911, and 1876 Sokak #17 D4, Izmir, Turkey. The Notice of Hearing informed Respondent that an administrative hearing in this matter was scheduled for October 13, 2016.

	9. Business and Professions Code section 118 states, in pertinent part:

	Respondent is in default. The Bureau will take action without further hearing based upon the

	<u>DETERMINATION OF ISSUES</u>
	1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent California University for
	Business Education has subjected its application for an approval to operate to denial.
	2. Service of Statement of Issues No. 1000737 and the related documents was proper
	and in accordance with the law.
	3. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
	4. The Director of Consumer Affairs is authorized to deny Respondent's application for
İ	licensure based upon the following violations alleged in the Statement of Issues:
	a. Title 5, California Code of Regulations (CCR), sections 71100, 71710 and 71720 for
	failing to demonstrate the educational programs are comprised of a curriculum that meets the

On October 13, 2016, Respondent failed to appear at the hearing. The Administrative

Law Judge found that service of the Notice of Hearing was reasonably calculated to provide

- b. Title 5, CCR, sections 71100 and 71715(d)(3) for failing to ensure that the materials and distance educational programs are current, well organized, and designed by faculty knowledgeable in distance education techniques;
- c. Title 5, CCR, sections 71100 and 71715, subdivisions (d)(3), (d)(4) and (d)(6), for failing to meet minimum operating standards regarding distance education;
- d. Title 5, CCR, sections 71100 and 71740, subdivisions (b), (c) and (d)(1-4) for failing to provide a library, access to the regular services of a professional librarian or information specialist experienced in the electronic retrieval of information, or access to the library collections and resources of another institution, organization, or library;
- e. Title 5, CCR, sections 71100 and 71770, and Code sections 94909 and 94920(d), in that the school's catalog submitted with Respondents' application failed to comply with the Bureau's statutes and regulations.

## <u>ORDER</u>

IT IS SO ORDERED that the application of Respondent California University of Business Education; Bruce Kelling, Hasbiye Uzgoren, and Dincer Karaca, owners, is hereby denied.

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

This Decision shall become effective on JAA 2 30.7
