22	1. Dr. Michael Marion, Jr. (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in his							
23	official capacity as the Chief of the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, Department of							
24	Consumer Affairs.	•						
25	2. On or about November 14, 2013, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education							
26	received an application for an Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer							
27	Educational Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions from Mission Career College							
28	(Respondent). On or about November 6, 2013, Tino Abila certified under penalty of perjury to

- (b) Except as provided in Section 94885.1, an institution offering a degree must satisfy one of the following requirements:
- (i) Accreditation by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education, with the scope of that accreditation covering the offering of at least one degree program by the institution.
- (ii) An accreditation plan, approved by the bureau, for the institution to become fully accredited within five years of the bureau's issuance of a provisional approval to operate to the institution. The provisional approval to operate to an unaccredited degree-offering institution shall be in compliance with Section 94885.5.
 - 6. Education Code Section 94886 states:

Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter.

7. Education Code Section 94887 states:

An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented sufficient evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the information provided by the applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant has the capacity to satisfy the minimum operating standards. The bureau shall deny an application for an approval to operate if the application does not satisfy those standards.

- 8. Education Code Section 94909 states in pertinent part:
- (a) Except as provided in subdivision (d), prior to enrollment, an institution shall provide a prospective student, either in writing or electronically, with a school catalog containing, at a minimum, all of the following:

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(2) Except as specified in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a statement that the institution is a private institution and that it is approved to operate by the bureau.

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(5) A description of the programs offered and a description of the instruction provided in each of the courses offered by the institution, the requirements for completion of each program, including required courses, any final tests or examinations, any required internships or externships, and the total number of credit hours, clock hours, or other increments required for completion.

...

- (7) Information regarding the faculty and their qualifications.
- (8) A detailed description of institutional policies in the following areas:

. . . .

- (B) Cancellation, withdrawal, and refund policies, including an explanation that the student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. The text shall also include a description of the procedures that a student is required to follow to cancel the enrollment agreement or withdraw from the institution and obtain a refund consistent with the requirements of Article 13 (commencing with Section 94919).
 - 9. Education Code Section 94913 states:
- (a) An institution that maintains an Internet Web site shall provide on that Internet Web site all of the following:
 - (1) The school catalog.
- (2) A School Performance Fact Sheet for each educational program offered by the institution.
 - (3) Student brochures offered by the institution.
 - (4) A link to the bureau's Internet Web site.
 - (5) The institution's most recent annual report submitted to the bureau.
- (b) An institution shall include information concerning where students may access the bureau's Internet Web site anywhere the institution identifies itself as being approved by the bureau.

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REGULATORY PROVISIONS

10. Title 5, CCR, section 71700 states:

"The Bureau may request that an institution document compliance with the standards set forth in the Act and this Division to obtain and maintain an approval to operate."

11. Title 5, CCR, section 71710 states:

In order to meet its mission and objectives, the educational program defined in section 94837 of the Code shall be comprised of a curriculum that includes:

- (a) those subject areas that are necessary for a student to achieve the educational objectives of the educational program in which the student is enrolled;
- (b) subject areas and courses or modules that are presented in a logically organized manner or sequence to students;
- (c) course or module materials that are designed or organized by duly qualified faculty. For each course or module, each student shall be provided with a syllabus or course outline that contains:
 - (1) a short, descriptive title of the educational program;
 - (2) a statement of educational objectives;
 - (3) length of the educational program;
 - (4) sequence and frequency of lessons or class sessions;
 - (5) complete citations of textbooks and other required written materials;
- (6) sequential and detailed outline of subject matter to be addressed or a list of skills to be learned and how those skills are to be measured;
 - (7) instructional mode or methods.
- (d) if degree granting, require research of an appropriate degree that utilizes a library and other learning resources;
- (e) specific learning outcomes tied to the sequence of the presentation of the material to measure the students' learning of the material; and
 - (f) evaluation by duly qualified faculty of those learning outcomes.
 - 12. Title 5, CCR, section 71475 states in pertinent part:

(e) The institution shall submit at the time it applies for renewal current financial
statements that meet the requirements of section 74115 as follows: (1) for an institution with
annual gross revenues of \$500,000 and over, statements shall be audited; (2) for an institution
with annual gross revenues less than \$ 500,000, statements shall be reviewed.

. . . .

- (i) The institution shall include in its application an organization chart that shows the governance and administrative structure of the institution and the relationship between faculty and administrative positions. If there have been no substantive changes since the last submission of an organizational chart, the institution may so state and is not required to submit documentation.
- (j) The institution shall provide in the application a description of the job duties and responsibilities of each administrative and faculty position. If there have been no substantive changes since the last submission, the institution may so state and is not required to submit documentation.
- (q) The institution shall include in its application copies of advertising and other statements disseminated to the public in any manner by the institution or its representatives that concern, describe, or represent each of the following:
 - (1) The institution.
 - (2) Each educational program offered by the institution.

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(u) For each educational program that the institution offers or proposes to offer, the application shall contain a statement that the educational program meets the requirements of section 71710, as well as the following unless there have been no substantive changes since the last submission. If there have been no substantive changes made the institution may so state and is not required to provide documentation:

(7) Upon request, the institution shall provide to the Bureau copies of the curriculum or syllabi required pursuant to section 71710.

(x) The application shall include a statement that the institution has contracted with sufficient duly qualified faculty members who meet the qualifications of section 71720 unless there have been no substantive changes since the last submission. If there have been no substantive changes made the institution may so state and is not required to provide

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documentation.

- "(z) The application shall include a description of library holdings, services, and other learning resources, including policies and procedures for supplying them to students who do not receive classroom instruction. The description need not consist of a list of each holding. The description shall include an explanation of how the library and other learning resources are sufficient to support the instructional needs of students and, if no facilities exist at the institution, how and when students may obtain access to a library and other learning resources as required by the curriculum unless there have been no substantive changes since the last submission. If there have been no substantive changes made the institution may so state and is not required to provide documentation."
 - 13. Title 5, CCR, section 71715 states in pertinent part:

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- (d) Distance education as defined in section 94834 of the Code, does not require the physical presence of students and faculty at the same location but provides for interaction between students and faculty by such means as telecommunication, correspondence, electronic and computer augmented educational services, postal service, and facsimile transmission. In addition to the other requirements of this chapter and the Act, an institution offering distance education shall:
- (4) provide for meaningful interaction with faculty who are qualified to teach using distance education methods;

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(6) timely complete student evaluations of learning outcomes by duly qualified faculty,
which are appropriate for use with the distance education methods used, and evaluated by duly
qualified faculty.

- Title 5, CCR, section 71720 states in pertinent part: 14.
- (b) Instructors in an Educational Program Not Leading to a Degree.
- (1) An institution shall employ instructors who possess the academic, experiential and rofessional qualifications to teach, including a minimum of three years of experience, education nd training in current practices of the subject area they are teaching. If an instructor does not ossess the required three years of experience, education and training in the subject area they are eaching, the institution shall document the qualifications the instructor possesses that are quivalent to the minimum qualifications.
 - 15. Title 5, CCR, section 71740 states:
- (b) An institution shall provide or make provisions for the library and other learning esources needed to support each educational program it offers, including resources such as eference works, periodicals, monographs, and media and equipment specific to the educational rograms offered.
- (c) An institution shall describe onsite library and other learning resources, if any, that enable students to pursue inquiries, searches for information and documentation, and assignments connected with their study programs.
- (d) An institution that depends for library and other learning resources primarily on other institutions' collections and resources not in its possession shall do all of the following:
 - (1) Describe those library and other learning resources, in the application and catalog.

- (2) Provide students and faculty with access to the regular services of a professional librarian or information specialist experienced in the electronic retrieval of information, who shall provide support for faculty in curriculum matters and actively serve as a resource guide for both graduate and undergraduate students.
- (3) Assure that students have access to the library collections and resources of another institution, organization, or library.
 - (4) Document compliance with paragraphs (1), (2), and (3).
 - 16. Title 5, CCR, section 71745 states:
- "(a) The institution shall document that it has at all times sufficient assets and financial resources to do all of the following:
- (1) Provide all of the educational programs that the institution represented it would provide.
- (2) Ensure that all students admitted to its educational programs have a reasonable opportunity to complete the programs and obtain their degrees or diplomas.
 - (3) Maintain the minimum standards required by the Act and this chapter.
 - (4) Pay timely refunds as required by Article 13 of the Act.
 - (5) Pay all operating expenses due within 30 days.
- (6) Maintain a ratio of current assets to current liabilities of 1.25 to 1.00 or greater at the end of the most recent fiscal year when using generally accepted accounting principles, or for an institution participating in Title IV of the federal Higher Education Act of 1965, meet the composite score requirements of the U.S. Department of Education. For the purposes of this section, current assets does not include: intangible assets, including goodwill, going concern value, organization expense, startup costs, long-term prepayment of deferred charges, and non-returnable deposits, or state or federal grant or loan funds that are not the property of the institution but are held for future disbursement for the benefit of students. Unearned tuition shall be accounted for in accordance with general accepted accounting principles.

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service and its cost;

- (5) Whether any instruction will occur in a language other than English and, if so, the level of proficiency required and the kind of documentation of proficiency, such as the United States Foreign Service Language Rating System, that will be accepted;
- (6) The institution's policies and practices regarding any form of financial aid, including all consumer information which the institution is required to disclose to the student under any state
- (7) The institution's policies and procedures for the award of credit for prior experiential learning, including assessment policies and procedures, provisions for appeal, and all charges that
 - (8) The institution's standards for student achievement;
- (9) A description of the facilities and of the types of equipment and materials that will be
- (10) A description of library and other learning resources and the procedures for student
- (11) If the institution offers distance education, the approximate number of days that will elapse between the institution's receipt of student lessons, projects, or dissertations and the institution's mailing of its response or evaluation.
 - (12) A description of all student services;
 - (13) Housing information including all of the following:
 - (A) Whether the institution has dormitory facilities under its control:
- (B) The availability of housing located reasonably near the institution's facilities and an estimation of the approximate cost or range of cost of the housing; and
- (C) If the institution has no responsibility to find or assist a student in finding housing, a clear and conspicuous statement so indicating. A statement that the program is "non-residential"
- (14) Policies on student rights, including the procedure for addressing student grievances:
 - (15) Policies on the retention of student records.

- 18. Title 5, CCR, section 74115 states:
- (a) This section applies to every set of financial statements required to be prepared or filed by the Act or by this chapter.
- (b) A set of financial statements shall contain, at a minimum, a balance sheet, an income statement, and a cash flow statement, and the preparation of financial statements, shall comply with all of the following:
- (1) Audited and reviewed financial statements shall be conducted and prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants by an independent certified public accountant who is not an employee, officer, or corporate director or member of the governing board of the institution.
- (2) Financial statements prepared on an annual basis as required by section 74110(b) shall be prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Nonprofit institutions shall provide annual financial statements as required under generally accepted accounting principles for nonprofit organizations.
- (3) The financial statements shall establish that the institution meets the requirements for financial resources required by Section 71745.
- (4) If an audit performed to determine compliance with any federal or state student financial aid program reveals any failure to comply with the requirements of the program and the noncompliance creates any liability or potential liability for the institution, the financial statements shall reflect the liability or potential liability.
- (5) Any audits shall demonstrate that the accountant obtained an understanding of the institution's internal financial control structure, assessed any risks, and has reported any material deficiencies in the internal controls.
- (c) Work papers for the financial statements shall be retained for five years from the date of the statements and shall be made available to the Bureau upon request.
- (d) "Current" with respect to financial statements means completed no sooner than 120 days prior to the time it is submitted to the Bureau, and covering no less than the most recent

complete fiscal year. If more than 8 months will have elapsed between the close of the most recent complete fiscal year and the time it is submitted, the fiscal statements shall also cover no less than five months of that current fiscal year.

19. Title 5, CCR, section 74117 states:

"In addition to the requirement in Section 94913(b) of the Code, an institution that maintains a website shall provide on the homepage of that website clear and conspicuous links to all the items required in Section 94913(a) of the Code."

FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards -Advertising and Other Public Statements)

- 20. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891(b) and 5, California Code of Regulations (CCR) section 71700 and 71475(q)(1-2) in that the institution provided copies of brochures for the educational programs that appear on the institution's website.
- 21. The circumstances are that the brochures for the Chemical Dependency Counselor, Heavy Equipment Operator and Medical Assistant programs do not include correct Bureau approval statements nor the institution's correct address.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards - Description of Educational Program

- 22. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891(b) and 5, CCR section 71710 subdivision (a)-(c) and 71475 subdivision (u)(7) in that the institution has not met minimum operating standards as it has not sufficiently demonstrated a fully developed curriculum that is ready to be delivered and that the subject areas and courses are presented in a logically organized manner or sequence to students.
- 23. The circumstances are that the Respondent failed to provide separate syllabi for each course for each of the programs that are offered. Moreover, some syllabi did not include the requisite information including, but not limited to, the approved program hours, distance education information, a clear sequence and frequency of the courses offered, the list of skills to

be learned and how those skills will be measured, complete textbook information nor correct institution's address.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards - Financial Resources and Statements)

- 24. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code section 94891(b) in conjunction with 5, CCR sections 74115 and 71475 subdivision (e), and 71745 in that after a substantive change in ownership, the Respondent did not provide financial statements to demonstrate that it has the financial resources to support the institution.
- 25. The circumstances are that on or about November 14, 2017, the Respondent provided a statement of assets and equity modified cash basis for January through December 2016. The total amount of stated assets exceeded \$500,000 and therefore required submission of an audited financial statement. Said submission was also required to contain, at a minimum, <u>current</u> financial information including a balance, sheet, income statement, and a cash flow statement.

FOURTH CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION

(Failure to Meet Minimum Operating Standards - Faculty)

- 26. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Education Code sections 94891(b) and 5, CCR sections 71715 subdivisions (d)(4) and (6) and 71720 subdivision (b) (1), 71475(x) in that Respondent's application does not satisfy the legally required minimum operating standards for faculty where the Respondent has not provided evidence that it employs faculty who possess the academic, experiential and professional qualifications to teach. The circumstances are as follows:
- 27. The Respondent did not provide sufficient documentation of resumes and qualifications for two faculty members who instruct in the CPR/First Aid program and the Water Technology Management programs.
- 28. The Respondent did not provide faculty names and qualifications for the following programs listed in the catalog: Chemical Dependency Counselor, Computer Office Specialist, Dialysis Technician, Massage Therapy, Mobile Crane Operator, Pharmacy Technician, and Tower Crane Operator. Faculty for these courses were instead listed as "TBA."

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of Consumer Affairs issue a decision:

- 1. Denying the application of Mission Career College for a Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer Educational Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions; and
 - 2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
