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1	2. On or about August 11, 2017, the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education	
2	received an application for Renewal of Approval to Operate an Accredited Institution from New	
3	America Beauty Education Corp., doing business as Hair California Beauty Academy	
4	(Respondent). The Bureau denied the application on August 10, 2018. On October 9, 2018,	
5	Respondent submitted to the Bureau a request for administrative hearing.	
6	JURISDICTION	
7	3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of	
8	Consumer Affairs (Director) for the Bureau for Private Postsecondary Education, under the	
9	authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Education Code unless	
10	otherwise indicated.	
11	4. Section 94885, subdivision (a) provides, in part:	
12	(a) The bureau shall adopt by regulation minimum operating standards for an institution that shall reasonably ensure that all of the following occur:	
13		
14	(9) The institution is maintained and operated in compliance with this chapter	
15	and all other applicable ordinances and laws.	
16	5. Section 94886 provides:	
17	Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section	
18	94802), a person shall not open, conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without obtaining an approval to operate under this	
19	chapter.	
20	6. Section 94887 provides:	
21	An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented sufficient evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the	
22	information provided by the applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant has the capacity to satisfy the minimum	
23	operating standards. The bureau shall deny an application for an approval to operate if the application does not satisfy those standards.	
24	REGULATORY PROVISIONS	
25	7. California Code of Regulations, title 5, section 71390, subdivision (b) provides:	
26	(b) An applicant shall submit to the Bureau the form required by subdivision

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6 7	(e) The institution demonstrates its continued capacity to meet the minimum operating standards by submitting the application signed and dated, and each fact stated therein and each attachment thereto declared to be true under penalty of perjury, as follows:	
8	(1) Signatories;	
9	(a) Each owner of the institution, or	
10	(B) If the institution is incorporated, the chief executive officer of the	
11	corporation and each person who owns or controls 25 percent or more of the stock or interest in the institution, or	
12	(C) Each member of the governing body of a nonprofit corporation.	
13	(2) The declaration shall be in the following form:	
14	"I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing and all attachments are true and correct."

22	9. Respondent's application is subject to denial because it fails to demonstrate that	
23	Respondent has the capacity to satisfy minimum operating standards, in that its application was	
24	not signed under penalty of perjury by all of the individuals who were identified in the Bureau's	
25	records as owners. (Educ. Code § 94887; and Cal. Code Regs., title 5, § 71480, subd. (e)).

1 2	SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION (Lack of Accreditation) (Educ. Code § 94887; and Cal. Code Regs., title 5, § 71480, subd. (d) and 71390, subd. (b))	
3	10. Respondent's application is subject to denial because it failed to submit verification	
4	that its accreditation has been renewed by its accreditation agency (i.e., failed to submit a certified	
5	copy of its current verification of accreditation). (Cal. Code Regs., title 5, § 71480, subd. (d) and	
6	71390, subd. (b).)	
7	PRAYER	
8	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged	
9	in this Statement of Issues, and that following the hearing, the Director of the Department of	
10	Consumer Affairs issue a decision:	
11	1. Denying Respondent's Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate an	
12	Accredited Institution; and	
13	2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
