_	JURISDICTION
2	3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Director of the Department of
	Consumer Affairs ("Director") for the Bureau, under the authority of the following laws. All
	section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise indicated.
	4. Code section 94886 states that:
	Except as exempted in Article 4 (commencing with Section 94874) or in compliance with
	the transition provisions in Article 2 (commencing with Section 94802), a person shall not open,
	conduct, or do business as a private postsecondary educational institution in this state without
	obtaining an approval to operate under this chapter.
	5. Code section 94887 states that:
	An approval to operate shall be granted only after an applicant has presented
	sufficient evidence to the bureau, and the bureau has independently verified the information provided by the applicant through site visits or other methods deemed appropriate by the bureau, that the applicant has the capacity to satisfy the minimum
	operating standards. The bureau shall deny an application for an approval to operate if the application does not satisfy those standards. The bureau may deny an application for an approval to operate institutions that would be owned by, have persons in
	control of, or employ institution managers that had knowledge of, should have known, or knowingly participated in any conduct that was the cause for revocation or unmitigated discipline at another institution.
	REGULATORY PROVISIONS
	6. Title 5, Section 71400.5 of the California Code of Regulations states in part:
	••••
	"(b) In addition to denying an application pursuant to section 94887 of the Code, the
	Bureau may deny any application based on any act that constitutes grounds for the denial of a
	license under Section 480 of the Business and Professions Code, incorporated herein by
	reference."
	7. Title 5, Section 71475 of the California Code of Regulations states, in pertinent part:
	(a) Unless renewed, an approval to operate shall expire at 12 midnight on the last day of the institution's term of approval to operate as granted pursuant to section 94802 or section 94889 of the Code.
	(b) An institution seeking to renew its Approval to Operate pursuant to section 94891 of the Code shall, prior to its expiration, complete and submit to the Bureau the "Application for Renewal of Approval to Operate and Offer Educations Programs for Non-Accredited Institutions," Form Application 94891 (rev. 2/10).
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2	(e) The institution shall submit at the time it applies for renewal current financial statements that meet the requirements of section 74115 as follows: (1) for an
3	institution with annual gross revenues of \$500,000 and over, statements shall be audited; (2) for an institution with annual gross revenues less than \$500,000,
4	statements shall be reviewed.
5	
6	(ii) Provided that a complete renewal application is received by the Bureau prior to the expiration of the approval, a valid approval to operate shall continue until the Bureau has acted upon the renewal application.

8 9	(kk) An incomplete application filed under this section will render the institution ineligible for renewal.
10	8. Title 5, Section 71745 of the California Code of Regulations states, in pertinent part:
11 12	(a) The institution shall document that it has at all times sufficient assets and financial resources to do all of the following:
12	(1) Provide all of the educational programs that the institution represented it would provide.
14 15	(2) Ensure that all students admitted to its educational programs have a reasonable opportunity to complete the programs and obtain their degrees or diplomas.
16	(3) Maintain the minimum standards required by the Act and this chapter.
17	(4) Pay timely refunds as required by Article 13 of the Act.
18	(5) Pay all operating expenses due within 30 days.
19	(6) Maintain a ratio of current assets to current liabilities of 1.25 to 1.00
20	or greater at the end of the most recent fiscal year when using generally accepted accounting principles, or for an institution participating in Title IV of the federal Higher Education Act of 1965, meet the composite score
21	requirements of the U.S. Department of Education. For the purposes of this section, current assets does not include: intangible assets, including goodwill,
22	going concern value, organization expense, startup costs, long-term prepayment of deferred charges, and non-returnable deposits, or state or federal grant or
23	loan funds that are not the property of the institution but are held for future disbursement for the benefit of students. Unearned tuition shall be accounted
24	for in accordance with general accepted accounting principles.
25 26	(b) At an institution's request, the Bureau may consider the financial resources of a parent company if the parent company, as defined by section 94853 of the Code, meets and maintains all of the following provisions:
27	(1) consents in writing to be sued in California;
28	(2) consents in writing to be subject to the jurisdiction of the Bureau with

1	respect to the institution's regulation under the Act and this Chapter;
2	(3) designates and maintains an agent for service of process, consistent with section 74190;
3	(4) agrees in writing to pay any refund, claim, penalty, or judgment that the institution is obligated to pay; and
4	(5) files financial reports, maintains financial records, and consents in
5	writing to permit the inspection and copying of financial records to the same extent as is required of the institution.
6 7	(c) An institution shall provide to the Bureau its most current financial statements upon request.
8	9. Title 5, Section 74115 of the California Code of Regulations states, in pertinent part:
9	(a) This section applies to every set of financial statements required to be prepared or filed by the Act or by this chapter.
10	(b) A set of financial statements shall contain, at a minimum, a balance sheet,
11	an income statement, and a cash flow statement, and the preparation of financial statements, shall comply with all of the following:
12	(1) Audited and reviewed financial statements shall be conducted and
13 14	prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants by an independent certified public accountant who is not an employee officer, or
14	independent certified public accountant who is not an employee, officer, or corporate director or member of the governing board of the institution.
16	(2) Financial statements prepared on an annual basis as required by section 74110(b) shall be prepared in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles established by the American Institute of Certified Public
17 18	Accountants. Nonprofit institutions shall provide annual financial statements as required under generally accepted accounting principles for nonprofit organizations.
19 20	(3) The financial statements shall establish that the institution meets the requirements for financial resources required by Section 71745.
20	(4) If an audit performed to determine compliance with any federal or
21	state student financial aid program reveals any failure to comply with the requirements of the program and the noncompliance creates any liability or
22 23	potential liability for the institution, the financial statements shall reflect the liability or potential liability.
23 24	(5) Any audits shall demonstrate that the accountant obtained an understanding of the institution's internal financial control structure, assessed
25	any risks, and has reported any material deficiencies in the internal controls.
26	(c) Work papers for the financial statements shall be retained for five years from the date of the statements and shall be made available to the Bureau upon request.
27	(d) "Current" with respect to financial statements means completed no sooner
28	than 120 days prior to the time it is submitted to the Bureau, and covering no less than
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1 2	the most recent complete fiscal year. If more than 8 months will have elapsed between the close of the most recent complete fiscal year and the time it is submitted, the fiscal statements shall also cover no less than five months of that current fiscal year.

17	iv.	On August 2, 2021, the Bureau sent a second deficiency letter confirming that
18		Respondent still had not submitted current reviewed or audited financial statements.

21	vi.	On November 29, 2021, Respondent submitted a balance sheet for 2019 and a profit
