Licensure examination passage data is not available from the state agency administering the examination. The above data is calculated by South Coast College from the agency pass list and an actual number of passes. More detailed exam results of the written and dictation portion are available at South Coast College.

The State examination consists of 3 parts: Academic (English and professional –law and medical), and dictation. These 2 academic tests and the dictation test is administered at different times and dates. The Licensure Passage is based on the first-time students sat for those 2 academic tests and the dictation.

In terms of actual numbers, from 2009 to 2017, South Coast College produced 152 licensed court reporters in contrast to 12 produced by a similar size program at a local community college.
