This program is new. Therefore, the number of students who graduate, the number of students who are placed, or the starting salary you can earn after finishing the educational program are unknown at this time. Information regarding general salary and placement statistics may be available from government sources or from the institution, but is not equivalent to actual performance data. Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are
 called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing
 employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved
 postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the
 applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the
 institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an
 examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination
 available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.



- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



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Student's Right to Cancel

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. Cancellation shall occur when the student **gives written notice of cancellation** to the school at the address specified in the agreement. The same address appears on the front of this catalog. If the student cancels the agreement, the student shall have no liability except for \$75.00 Non-refundable Enrollment Fee and items in the "Student Bundle." **These items can only be refunded if not opened and/or used**. If the student fails to return items within a ten-day period, he/she will accrue charges that will be deducted from the refund. The school shall refund any consideration paid by the student within 30 days after the school receives notice of cancellation.

WITHDRAWAL/REFUND

Institutions shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a reasonable deposit or application fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250), if notice of cancellation is made through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh class day after enrollment, whichever is later. The student has the right to withdraw from a course of instruction at any time and receive a prorated refund for the unused portion of the tuition. Refund Formula: The amount of the refund has to be calculated on a prorata basis, less a \$75.00 non-refundable registration fee and any items supplied in the Student Bundle supplied by the school that were not returned within ten days. The refund formula is as follows: total paid minus registration fee and student bundle multiplied by hours of instruction received minus unreturned equipment equals total refund. The refund is calculated on the day we receive cancellation in writing. If the student does not send us a written notice of cancellation we wait until the third absence and drop the student from the class and calculate the refund accordingly. Refunds will be processed and paid within 30 days. Students are eligible for refunds only if they have completed 60% of less of the instructions.
