Program Termination and Refunds: Under certain circumstances a program may be terminated and refunds may be due you. Following are the definitions relating to program termination:

A. Cancellation "Cancellation" occurs when a student cancels their FLS program before leaving their country or beginning their program. If the student is eligible for a loan guaranteed by the federal or state government and the student defaults on the loan, both of the following may occur:

- (1) The federal or state government or a loan guarantee agency may take action against the student, including applying any income tax refund to which the person is entitled to reduce the balance owed on the loan.
- (2) The student may not be eligible for any other federal student financial aid at another institution or other government assistance until the loan is repaid.

In regard to program extensions: For students who withdraw before completing 60% of any additional program of study (extension), FLS will retain a prorated amount of tuition. For students who withdraw after completing 60% of any additional program, FLS will retain all of the charges for the program.
