

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A student has a right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session or seventh day after enrollment whichever is later. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

CANCELLATION REFUND POLICY

An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within seven (7) days of executing the enrollment agreement is entitled to a refund of all monies paid, excluding the non-refundable registration fee.



STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

A student has a right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session or seventh day after enrollment whichever is later. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

CANCELLATION REFUND POLICY

An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within seven (7) days of executing the enrollment agreement is entitled to a refund of all monies paid, excluding the non-refundable registration fee.

Rejection: An applicant rejected by the school is entitled to a refund of all monies paid.

Other Cancellations: An applicant requesting cancellation more than seven (7) days after executing the enrollment agreement and making an initial payment, but prior to the first day of class is entitled to a refund of all monies paid, less the \$250 non-refundable registration fee.

Withdrawal Procedure:

- 5. A student choosing to withdraw from the school after the commencement of classes is to provide a written notice to the Chief Academic Officer. The notice must include the expected last date of attendance and be signed and dated by the student.
- 6. If special circumstances arise, a student may request, in writing, a leave of absence, which should include the date the student anticipates the leave beginning and ending. The withdrawal date will be the date the student is scheduled to return to from the leave of absence but fails to do so.
