Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a full refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session (first day of classes), or the seventh day after enrollment (seven days from the date when enrollment agreement was signed), whichever is later.

After the end of the cancellation period, you also have the right to stop school at any time; and you have the right to receive a pro-data refund if you have completed 60 percent or less of the enrollment period in the entire course.

The notice of cancellation shall be in writing and submitted directly to the Financial Aid Office at following address: SANTA ANA BEAUTY COLLEGE, 1926 W 17th Street, Santa Ana, CA 92706.

If the enrollment Agreement is canceled the school will refund the student any money he/she paid, less a registration or administration fee not to exceed \$250, and less any deduction for equipment not returned in good condition, within 45 days after the notice of cancellation is received.

If the applicant is not accepted by the school, he/she is entitled for a full refund except a non-refundable registration or administration fee. Once more than 60 percent of the enrollment period in the entire course has elapsed (including absences), there will be no refund to the student. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student may be entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.

<u>Course Cancellation</u>: If a course is cancelled subsequent to a student's enrollment and before instruction in the course has begun, the school provides a full refund of all monies paid.
