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

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### **Definitions**



For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable education program.

#### **REFUND CALCULATION GUIDELINES**

The refund policy for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of attendance shall be a pro rata refund. i.e For students who enroll, begin classes, and withdraw anytime after the 7-day period refunds will be calculated on a pro-rata based upon the percentage of the number of course hours scheduled to be completed at the time of withdrawal to the total length of the course less the registration fee and equipment/book kit cost.
