STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

An institution offering a distance educational program where the instruction is not offered in real time shall transmit the first lesson and any materials to any student within seven days after the institution accepts the student for admission.

The student shall have the right to cancel the agreement and receive a full refund pursuant to California Code of Regulations Section 71750 before the first lesson and materials are received. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation to the University of Silicon Andhra, to the attention of: Mr. Raju Chamarthi, CAO. If you cancel this Agreement, the school will refund any money that you paid, less any non-refundable charges. Refunds are made within forty-five days after your Notice of Cancellation is received.

REFUND POLICY:
