Graduates Employed in the Field means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.

Placement Rate Employed in the Field is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.

Number of Graduates Taking Exam is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.

First Available Exam Date is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.

Passage Rate is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.

Number Who Passed First Available Exam is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.

Salary is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.

No Salary Information Reported is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.

STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

The student has the right to cancel the enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through attendance at the first class session, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. The institution shall refund 100 percent of the amount paid for institutional charges, less a registration fee not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250). A notice of cancellation shall be in writing, and a withdrawal may be effectuated by the student's written notice to the Chief Academic Officer, 16025 Gale Ave., City of Industry, CA 91745 by email to jlcbeautyschool@gmail.com or by the student's conduct, including, but not necessarily limited to, a student's lack of attendance. Cancellation is effective on the date written notice of cancellation is sent. The institution shall issue a refund for unearned institutional charges if the student cancels an enrollment agreement or withdraws during a period of attendance. The refund policy for students who have completed 60 percent or less of the period of scheduled attendance shall be a pro rata refund. The institution shall pay or credit refunds within 45 days of a student's cancellation or withdrawal. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of moneys not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.
